DISCUSSION:

In June 2016, the Office of the District Attorney of Humboldt County submitted an application for annual funding through California Governor's Office of Emergency Services for FY 2016-17, for the District Attorney Victim Witness Assistance Program. The funding is available through the Victim Witness Assistance Office (VWAO) and the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), a combination of Federal and State funds which are managed and dispersed annually to eligible counties by Cal OES. The annual application was approved for funding in the amount of \$198,153 in June 2016. The District Attorney has since been given permission by Cal OES to apply for a grant award augmentation in the amount of \$41,523 with a VOCA match of \$13,841.

The attached Grant Award Face Sheet and Certifications of Assurance are required for the District Attorney to receive the grant funding. It is recommended that the Board authorize the Chair to sign these documents.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Approval of the grant augmentation will allow the County to be reimbursed up to a maximum of \$239,676 for services performed in accordance with the scope of work described in the grant for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. A match in funding is required of \$46,271. The match is included with the VWAO funds on the Face Sheet resulting in a total project cost of \$285,947. This match is obtained by utilizing a portion of salary and benefit of the Program Coordinator along with a portion of the salary from the Legal Office Assistant assigned to the Victim Witness Division who provide services to all crime victims of Humboldt County. These positions are allocated in other District Attorney budget units. The supplemental budget of \$41,523 will be allocated toward a Victim Witness Specialist (extra help) position along with the purchase of computers and scanners to assist in the deployment of a fully functional data collections system.

Approval of the requested grant augmentation for \$41,523 supports the Boards Strategic Framework by seeking outside funding sources to benefit Humboldt County needs.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board may choose not to approve the grant application. This is not recommended as it would cause a loss of anticipated revenue for the District Attorney. Furthermore it would leave the community, as well as the region, without the local service to victims and witnesses of crime.
