Dear Dean Boone:

On behalf of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, I am writing to convey our support for the highest ranking possible of a tenure-track faculty position in *Rangeland Ecology & Management* within the Forestry & Wildland Resources Department. This position is critical for the teaching mission of rangeland resource science, and also for the outreach and research expectations of a tenure-track faculty position.

Pressing needs exist for outreach and applied research in collaboration with local ranchers, UC Cooperative Extension, and Natural Resources Conservation Service personnel. Professor Fulgham supervised many graduate students working on their master's thesis projects and many undergraduates working on their senior projects in our regional rural communities.

We understand from Drs. Fulgham and Marshall that the RRS Program has been removed from Academic Probation and has submitted a request for a tenure-track faculty position. We also understand that in the ranking process within your college the range position was placed at #5. We encourage you to prioritize the range position more highly before the ranking process progresses to higher levels.

HSU's developing Strategic Plan emphasizes environmental responsibility in a diverse and globalized world and meaningful relationships with local communities. As representatives of landowners in the most enduring and economically productive agricultural sector in Northern California, we feel that this position is vital for the teaching, outreach, and research mission of HSU and will greatly benefit landowners in the Northcoast Region.
