- Authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors and Humboldt County Sheriff to sign four (4) original copies of the Patrol Operating Financial Plan (Attachment 1) and modifications, extensions and all other documents required by USDA Forest Service for participation in the Master Agreement of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Patrol Operating Plan; and
- 4. Authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors and Humboldt County Sheriff to sign four (4) original copies of the Drug Operations Financial Plan (Attachment 2) and modifications, extensions and all other documents required by USDA Forest Service for participation in the Master Agreement of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Drug Operations Plan.

SOURCE OF FUNDING:

USDA Forest Service Six Rivers National Forest

DISCUSSION:

The USDA Forest Service makes funds available through Six Rivers National Forest through a Five-year Cooperative Law Enforcement Master Agreement for added law enforcement and drug operations services in Forest Service campgrounds and on roads maintained by the Forest Service. The current five-year Master Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement was approved by your Board on October 13, 2015 for the period beginning October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2020. Modifications are signed each year for approval of annual financial plans, for both the Patrol Operating Plan (Attachment 1) and the Drug Operations Plan (Attachment 2). In the past annual financial modifications were brought to your Board for review, however, staff is recommending that you authorize the Chair and Sheriff to sign annual modifications for the duration of the this agreement period.

The Cooperative Law Enforcement Master Agreement establishes a cooperative effort between the Sheriff and local Forest Service offices to enhance local law enforcement in connection with law enforcement activities on National Forest Service lands, and provide for reimbursement to the Sheriff's Office for services provided under this agreement.

FINÂNCIAL IMPACT:

The USDA Forest Service Cooperative Law Enforcement Five-year Master Agreement authorizes reimbursement for services provided to the Forest Service by the Sheriff's Office. Reimbursement rates are negotiated each year with operating agreement modifications that begin October 1 each year and expire September 30 of the following year. Modifications 005 and 006 are detailed as follows:

Approval of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement for patrols on lands under the control of Six Rivers National Forest, meets the Board of Supervisors' Strategic Framework Plan by ensuring inter-jurisdictional and regional cooperation to provide community appropriate levels of service.

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ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board could deny approval of the Cooperative Law Enforcement annual financial plans with USDA Forest Service, however, this is not recommended as it would leave the County without reimbursement for services performed on Federal lands.

B. Reimbursement for all types of enforcement activities shall be at the following rates unless specifically stated otherwise:

\$0.50/mile patrolled Per diem rate is \$44/day + \$86 for lodging actuals, per day Wages at the prevailing rate of \$40.00/hour or base + half

II. PATROL ACTIVITIES:

- A. Time schedules for patrols will be flexible to allow for emergencies, other priorities, and day-to-day needs of both the Cooperator and the U.S. Forest Service. Ample time will be spent in each area to make residents and visitors aware that law enforcement officers are in the vicinity.
 - 1. Patrol on following U.S. Forest Service roads:

Roads designated and maintained by the U.S. Forest Service within the Cooperator's jurisdiction.

2. Patrol in the following campgrounds, developed sites, or dispersed areas:

To make vehicle patrols within the Six Rivers National Forest to include campgrounds, day use areas, developed sites, boat ramps, dispersed sites and other areas of concentrated use.

Additional patrols during the three (3) major summer holiday weekends as needed or requested.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$5,000.00.

III. TRAINING:

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See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-J and IV-L for additional information.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: $\frac{1,500.00}{1,500.00}$

NOTE: Funds not used for Training may be used for Patrol activities.

IV. EQUIPMENT:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provisions IV-J, IV-L, IV-M and IV-N for additional information.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: $\frac{1,500.00}{1,500.00}$

NOTE: Funds not used for Equipment may be used for Patrol activities.

Unused training and/or equipment funds may be used for patrol activities, in which case the maximum reimbursement for Patrol Activities may not exceed the amount of: **\$8,000.00**.

V. SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS:

- A. Special Enforcement Situations include but are not limited to: Fire Emergencies, Drug Enforcement, and certain Group Gatherings.
- B. Funds available for special enforcement situations vary greatly from year to year and must be specifically requested and approved prior to any reimbursement being authorized. Requests for funds should be made to the U.S. Forest Service designated representative listed in Item I-A of this Annual Operating Plan. The designated representative will then notify whether funds will be authorized for reimbursement. If funds are authorized, the parties will then jointly prepare a revised Annual Operating Plan.
 - 1. Drug Enforcement: This will be handled on a case by case basis. The request will normally come from the Patrol Captain; however, it may come from the Special Agent in Charge or their designated representative. Reimbursement shall be made

at the rates specified in Section I-B. Deputies assigned to the incident will coordinate all of their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.

- 2. Fire Emergency: During emergency fire suppression situations and upon request by the Forest Service pursuant to an incident resource order, the Cooperator agrees to provide special services beyond those provided under Section II-A, within the Cooperator's resource capabilities, for the enforcement of State and local laws related to the protection of persons and their property. The Cooperator will be compensated at the rate specified in Section I-B; the Forest Service will specify times and schedules. Upon concurrence of the local Patrol Captain or their designated representative, an official from the Incident Management Team managing the incident, Cooperator personnel assigned to an incident where meals are provided will be entitled to such meals.
- 3. Group Gatherings: This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notices, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organization rendezvous. Upon authorization by a Forest Service representative listed in Section I-A for requested services of this nature, reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section I-B. Deputies assigned to this type of incident will normally coordinate their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.

This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notice, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organizational rendezvous.

II. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OPERATIONS

Pursuant to *IV- J* of Agreement No. 16-LE-11051360-027, the following is in support of operations to suppress manufacturing and trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, with an emphasis on identification, apprehension and prosecution of suspects engaged in these activities:

- A. The U.S. Forest Service agrees:
 - 1. To reimburse <u>HCSO</u> for expenditures associated with the detection of locations and activities related to illegal production and trafficking of controlled substances, including;

- a. Ground reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- b. Aerial reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 2. To reimburse <u>HCSO</u> for certain expenses resulting from investigative activities associated with investigating cases involving the illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, including:
 - a. Surveillance operations to identify persons illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - b. Apprehension of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - c. Collection of evidence to support prosecution of persons suspected of illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - d. Prosecution of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 3. To reimburse <u>HCSO</u> for expenses resulting from the removal of cannabis plants from National Forest System lands. When circumstances indicate that removal of the cannabis plants is required before an investigation to determine the person(s) responsible can be completed, eradication operations must be approved by the U.S. Forest Service prior to taking place.

Note: <u>HCSO</u> retains the authority to eradicate cannabis plants from National Forest System lands without reimbursement from the U.S. Forest Service at its discretion.

4. To reimburse <u>HCSO</u> for the costs of purchasing supplies and equipment used exclusively for activities described in items A.1, A.2 and A.3 of this Plan. Purchases must be agreed to and approved by the U.S. Forest Service.

Purchases may not exceed 10% of the total allocation without prior approval by the U.S. Forest Service Designated Representative.

B. HCSO agrees:

1. Within its capability, to perform the following activities on National Forest System lands:

- a. Detect and inventory locations associated with illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances, and notify the U.S. Forest Service of such locations as soon as possible.
- b. Investigations to determine the person(s) responsible for manufacturing or trafficking controlled substances.
- c. Upon request and prior approval of the U.S. Forest Service, remove cannabis plants from National Forest System lands.
- 2. To furnish all activity reports, crime reports, investigation reports, and other reports or records, resulting from activities identified in **Section II**, **A** of this Operating and Financial Plan to the affected Forests for review and forwarding to the Regional Office for processing.
- C. The U.S. Forest Service and HCSO mutually agree to the following:
 - 1. The following rate schedule will apply to all expenditures that may be reimbursed to **HCSO** under this agreement;

Salary (overtime)	\$60.00 per hour,
Per diem costs	\$39/ M&IE + \$60 /Lodging,
Travel (mileage and fares)	\$0.61 per mile,
Helicopter flight time	Actual documented costs,
Supplies or equipment	Actual documented costs

D. Any remaining funding in this Annual Operating Plan may be carried forward to the next fiscal year and will be available to spend through the term of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement, or de-obligated at the request of the U.S. Forest Service.
