AMENDMENT NUMBER 1 PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AND

HUMBOLDT COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2016-2017 THROUGH 2017-2018

The parties, the County of Humboldt, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY," and Humboldt County Office of Education a California government entity, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR," entered into a Professional Services Agreement which became effective on October 25, 2016 (the Agreement).

The parties now desire to amend certain provisions of the Professional Services Agreement to increase school-based nutrition education and physical activity promotion to elementary school students at four (4) low resource school sites;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree to amend the following Sections and Exhibits as follows:

- 1. <u>DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES</u>: Exhibit A Scope of Work dated October 25, 2016 is hereby amended, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. In anticipation of a Thirty Three Thousand Fifteen Dollar (\$33,015) increase in funds, CONTRACTOR agrees to increase the number school-based nutrition education services from sixty (60) classrooms to eighty-four (84) classrooms in order to reach more low-income elementary students and families with nutrition education services including Harvest of the Month activities, garden-based nutrition education and improvements to school nutrition environment.
- 4. <u>COMPENSATION</u>: Exhibit B Schedule of Rates dated October 25, 2016 is hereby amended, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. For the contractual term period of October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017, the maximum amount payable by COUNTY for services rendered by CONTRACTOR, is One Hundred Eleven Thousand Six Hundred Fifty One Dollars (\$111,651).

Except as modified herein, the Professional Services Agreement executed on October 25, 2016 shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this first amendment and the original Professional Services Agreement, the provisions of this first amendment shall govern.

The following activities (including selection of school sites, educational materials, curricula, and evaluation methods) have been selected in accordance with Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) Guidelines, as set forth by California Department of Public Health's NEOP Branch in grant agreement 16-10150. Activity and objective numbers correspond to Humboldt County's Integrated Work Plan, approved by the State and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for FFY 2017-19.

SCHOOL-BASED NUTRITION EDUCATION & ACTIVITY PROMOTION

NEOP Objective #2: By September 30, 2017, at four (4) low resource school sites, HCOE educators and eighty-four (84) trained extenders (classroom teachers) will reach four hundred (400) elementary students with direct education, one thousand three hundred (1300) students with indirect education, and one thousand eight hundred (1800) parents with indirect education, and HCOE staff will work with partners including school food service staff/school wellness committees to improve the school cafeteria environment at one school site by increasing sourcing of local produce and adoption of Smarter Lunchroom Movement strategies.
