Humboldt County TFC RFP Response - Cost Proposal Clarifications

1. Attachment B - Cost Proposal -

- a. See attached updated Cost Proposal. The original document that we were working from estimated 5 days per week per youth of Foster Parent billing and 4 hours per week per youth of Specialty Mental Health over and above the Foster Parent support. This model got cross-walked into this line item; therefore the wrong amount was listed, our apologies.
 Additionally, for the purposes of this contract, we budgeted 7 days per week for Foster Parent-provided TFC SMH Services (providing a maximum estimate), but it is likely that not all Foster Parents will provide these services to that extent; more likely an average of 5 days per week per youth, resulting in a reduction for overall SMH Services costs.
- b. With the goal of children and youth moving to a lower level of care or finding permanency, it is RCS' experience through TFCO, RBS and ITFC that a fully integrated Mental Health, Social Services and Community Supportive Program result in the most positive outcomes. We are proposing the following:

Maximum 4 hours per week @ \$2.45 per unit of services for 20 youth = \$611,520 See addendum

These services would consist of therapy, individual rehab, family therapy, collateral and case management services as is deemed appropriate by the child and family team, if found to be medically necessary through the Bio-Social Assessment Process. Specific details can be worked out in person.

2. Attachment B-3 - Cost Proposal / Additional Resources

a. As you are aware, the recruitment and development of the Certified Foster Parent is extremely specific, time consuming and expensive. In order to develop the highest quality TFC Parent, recruitment, education and training must go hand in hand. RCS has been providing targeted and intensive therapeutic foster parent services for over 20 years. In that time, we have worked with our local community college to provide some Foster Parent training; however, it has been our experience that in order to provide the most relative and successful on-going trauma-informed approach to the foster children in our care, there must be an enhanced education, training and intervention practice between the TFC Parents, Social Work and Program Staff. For this reason, targeted, on-going training, and support needs access to this additional funding. It is, however, possible for RCS to be a provider for our Program through a sub-contract with College of the Redwoods, as we have done with Chabot College in Mendocino County. We look forward to working with College of the Redwoods and your agency to develop such collaboration if accepted.

Redwood Community Services, Inc will provide a full range of Foster Care options to the Humboldt County community once established; FFA, ITFC, TFCO, Regional Center, respite and any other program models that the Humboldt DHS would request. This budget by definition is incomplete in that the costs for the "stand-alone" Foster Care clinical intervention outweighs the rate for the service. Furthermore, it is clinically impossible to provide the expected outcomes without the appropriate level of Specialty Mental Health Services. Therefore, this budget is contigent on a SMH Contract to properly implement this program model in support of the clients, as well as offset some of the shared SMH costs in order to provider total client support. RCS is striving to pay the highest stipend to the Foster Parent while providing necessary clinical and quality control under Medi-Cal regulations.

RCS understands that this is a Mental Health Proposal; but as an integrated plan, we will need a start-up recruitment and training contract with Humboldt DHS in order to become a new provider in the Humboldt Community.
