DISCUSSION:

This supplemental budget request reflects year-end budget adjustments as a result of greater than anticipated revenue from two sources of state revenue, unclaimed gas tax (State Aid for Agriculture) and pesticide mill assessment (State Aid for Pesticide Regulation) disbursements. The department's budget is developed before counties are informed by the California Department of Food and Agriculture and Department of Pesticide Regulation as to the individual allocations counties will receive.

Approval of this supplemental budget is consistent with your Board's Strategic Framework of enforcing laws and regulations to protect residents by providing funding for Agricultural Commissioner to fulfill statutory mandates.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no impact to the General Fund. This supplemental budget request covers greater than anticipated expenditures in extra-help in Fiscal Year 2016-17, and reflects the department's increase in staffing and training to meet the increased workload associated with the cannabis track and trace and cultivation site inspection program.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board may choose not to approve the supplemental budget. This is not recommended because the greater than anticipated revenue has allowed the department to cover costs associated with preparing for the increased workload associated with regulating cannabis without assistance from the county general fund.
