I understand that a second dispensary is trying to open a few doors away. I believe this would be wrong on many levels

- 1. The laws and zoning in place currently do not allow tow dispensaries in close proximity. These restrictions were put into place by elected officials after much study and contemplation. To override their judgment makes a mockery of our government, and would open the doors to even more requests to grant exceptions to current laws and zoning.
- 2. Myrtletown has always been a family friendly place. Allowing two dispensaries in one small shopping complex that already has a smoke shop catering to drug paraphernalia, a bar and a liquor store in no way uplifts the community.
