Subject: Small timber landowners in CA are SOL and real world realities are the pits

Did you miss me?

I received in the mail timber yield tax information, and knowing what I have learned as an experienced field forester, I laughed at what is happening to especially the small timber owners and timber harvesting in California.

As a seventy plus year old person with sound mind and body and living in the real world, as a field experienced forester for fifty plus years, as a landowner who is a minority voter especially in California who owns some timberland, and learning much more, I see humans creating complicated and confusing laws which lack real world realities. Like meetings where my input is no longer recognized and ignored, humans create laws that make little to no sense to me.

As someone who has been in marijuana gardens, been confronted by marijuana growers, has refused bribes, had a family member use marijuana who is now clean, had and have relatives and friends in law enforcement, had friend and fellow forester killed by a marijuana grower, and who now is armed when he goes into the field, I see experience being ignored.

I agree a lot of what Trump says and I voted for Trump; however, as rich person in the upper class, I am still waiting to see if he does right by open space, tree farmers, timber industry, ranchers, farmers, and other rural folks. Hi-tech is misused and not going to solve future problems, and because way humans are going, they will let fire takeover and destroy habitats for species. Real world experience helps.

You can read some of what I think, or not. Many especially older folks do not know how to use computers, and we are being lead by an inexperienced voting majority which is sometimes the voting minority. I see inexperienced humans burning-up wild-lands and open space. I see hi-tech used wrongly. I see average person not knowing when they break our complicated and confusing laws. I see regulations and legalese as interpreted by faulty humans made which do not fit real world realities. I see what I have learned about growing, harvesting and milling timber, marijuana, and other things. I see open-space, tree farmers, timber industry, ranchers, farmers, and other rural folks especially in CA eventually disappearing. I see things desired by species laying fallow or getting burnt-up. And on and on and on.

I see many things and this nation with divided thinking. Few have learned when there is time to do otherwise and attention paid to experienced people is being lost to the ages. As verified by my input and attendance at meetings, my one vote based on what I have learned does little good. I can see what I have learned is being ignored, and I see species and humans headed for bad times.

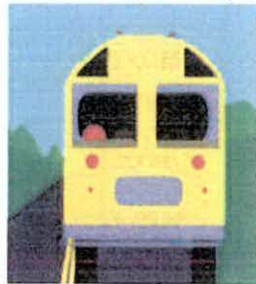

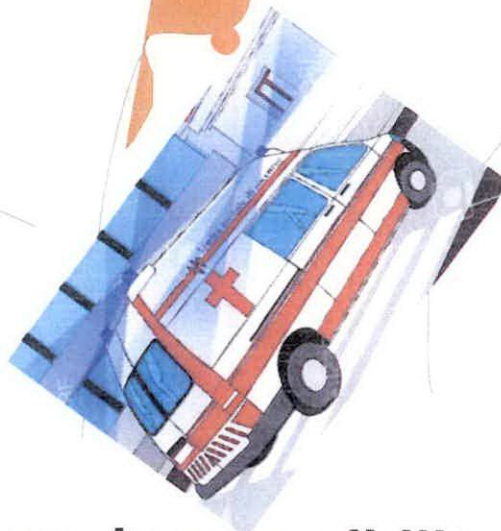

**Introduction:**

After the record setting wet winter of 2016-2017, many roads in Humboldt County obtained more than usual damage and effects from the storms. While many roads have been repaired and fixed, it is still noticeable that the Shelter Cove Road from Whitethorn all the way to the community of Shelter Cove has had only minor repairs. Besides the yearly wear and tear of the roads with eroding sides, turnouts and major potholes, this year, two NEW sections of entire hillside erosion have occurred. These damaged areas have made it necessary to put up caution barriers and install stop signs and limit the road width to one lane, making it a very dangerous and non-satisfactory safe driving situation. After many comments and observations from the community, a petition was drafted and was circulated around Shelter Cove asking for improvements to be made to the road.

We are presenting to you, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, the County Administrative Officer, and to the Public Works Department, this petition on behalf of the **910 concerned people** who signed it this summer. The Petition reads:

*" The current conditions on Shelter Cove Road are not safe due to (1) potholes, (2) collapsing shoulders, and (3) poorly maintained turnouts. These conditions have resulted in excessive vehicle damage and avoidable accidents, as well as serving as a deterrent to those visiting who may not return to the Cove because of these hazardous road conditions. Shelter Cove is a remote community of year round and seasonal residents and tourists who rely on safe travel via this only access road we have available.*



*In April 2014, Humboldt County citizens told the Board of Supervisors they were concerned about the lack of funding that is available for public safety services. In response, voters in November passed Measure Z, a half-cent sales tax, to pay for maintaining and enhancing services. Public Works received over 15% of Measure Z funds, almost \$2 million with \$755,000 allotted specifically for Southern County needs. According to the County website, Public Works is responsible for maintaining roads and bridges so as to provide "safe roads for the citizens of Humboldt County." The budget for the Roads division in 2015/16 (actual) was \$2,084,759. The 2016/17 adopted budget for Roads is \$4,389,164 — more than double that of the previous year.*

*We, the undersigned, residents, property and business owners, request the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors direct the Public Works Roads division to promptly and properly fix the poor road conditions on Shelter Cove Road, including all potholes, shoulders and turnouts. Time is of the essence as Summer residents and tourists add a significant seasonal population."*

The petitions were placed in several businesses as well as the Library, Cape Mendocino Lighthouse and the Visitors Center/Art Gallery. We knew that there was concern but we were surprised by the number of people who signed it from a modest size community of about 600 residents.

### **Significance of Materials being presented:**

Signatures were obtained from **Nine Hundred and Ten (910)** concerned residents and visitors: 425 full and part-time residents of Shelter Cove; 485 visitors, including those who frequently travel the road between Shelter Cove and Redway, as well as many more of your constituents in the greater Humboldt area.

### Additional Support Received

The petition organizers also received support from the Resort Improvement District #1 Board of Directors as well as the following community organizations: the Cape Mendocino Lighthouse Preservation Society, Shelter Cove Property Owners Association (SCPOA), Shelter Cove Arts and Recreation Foundation (SCARF), and the Shelter Cove Pioneers. Our community effort to request attention to the severity of the only road into and out of the Cove received **unanimous support** from all these prominent community organizations.

It's also important to note that all board votes occurred **after** the minor repairs were made this summer by Public Works. The boards' signed letters have been included in your packets. Here are some of their main concerns:

### Resort Improvement District #1 August 23, 2017

*"We have sustained two areas of major damage on steep, blind curves, where the road is down to single lanes and traffic is controlled by stop signs."*

*"The much-needed pullouts are mostly unusable."*

*"The recent repairs, although much appreciated, are not enough to make the road safe."*

### Shelter Cove Property Owners Association, SCPOA September 15, 2017

*"...it is still very noticeable that the Shelter Cove Road from Whitethorn to the community of Shelter Cove is still in need of major repairs."*

*"[We] represent over 200 property owners..." and "The condition of our only road into Shelter Cove has a profound effect on Property Values and future growth to the area."*



Shelter Cove Arts and Recreation Foundation, SCARF September 21, 2017

*"[We] are in support of the community's efforts to remedy this safety issue."*

Cape Mendocino Lighthouse Preservation Society September 25, 2017

*"Obtaining operational funds...depends on the voluntary donations of visitors."*

*"The number of visitors... has dropped ...over 16% compared to 2016."*

*"Keeping the lighthouse in good repair and open for visitors is a requirement of our MOU with BLM."*

Businesses supported this effort for improved road safety. They welcomed the petition on their valuable counter space and encouraged patrons to read and sign. Our to-be-newest business, wrote a letter of support which included the following:

Gypso Ale Mill September 15, 2017

*"Opening a business in such a beautiful, yet isolated, area has its challenges."*

*"As future business owners, we will rely on a well maintained Shelter Cove Road for supplies and material. And as our County representative, we are certain you do not want to make arriving at our establishment any more challenging or even dangerous for our patrons."*

And many other comments from Shelter Cove residents, such as:

*"There is no signage on the road in places where it is safe to pull off and let a vehicle pass."*

*"Vehicles that tailgate put so much pressure on the driver [ahead] that bad decisions are made as to where to pull off." - Janie Hodges*

*"...not good in an emergency. Especially the kind that requires an ambulance in or out." - Carrie McMahon*

*"One natural disaster and we are SOL!" - Tessa Knight*

*"If you have kids that are off to school or in town when that road goes out do you have people on the other side that can take care of them... This is not OK..."*

*- Debbie Edeline, Shelter Cove resident*

*"Even though we have alternative routes, [they] are not meant for heavy travel. Over a period of time.. it'll create more problems..." - Mary Neufeld*

## Wrap-Up/Closing:

We all know there are other areas and roads in Humboldt County that also need repairs, some perhaps as bad as Shelter Cove Road. And of course, there are limited funds that can be spent each year on road maintenance. **But we also all know that this is the one and only road into and out of our area, which makes it even more crucial for it to be improved to a safe condition as soon as possible.**

What we are requesting:

- ◆ That the Board acknowledge there is a major and dangerous problem on Shelter Cove Road, especially with the two new landslides.
- ◆ That a priority is given to complete the repairs needed to make the road safe once again.
- ◆ That the Board notify the Community on the county's budget process and timeline, so Shelter Cove can be part of the process, and to reemphasize at that time the need for the road repairs and improvements and other safety issues.

Shelter Cove is a very desirable location. And we can expect increased traffic on Shelter Cove Road this coming year: the brewery, businesses, and restaurants will be opening. The Humboldt Bay Harbor Recreation & Conservation District, now managing the marina, has plans to redevelop the marina facilities, and with that economic growth and tourism dollars we will increasingly depend on a safe road.

First impressions are important and we want – no, we NEED – people to return for recreation, to savor the natural beauty of the Lost Coast, and potentially relocate here in the Cove. Please, please make a decision and take action soon before there is a serious incident that could have been prevented. We thank you and look forward to working with you!

The Resort Improvement District No. 1 Board of Directors wish to give their full support to the Shelter Cove community and endorse their attached petition concerning the dangerous condition of Shelter Cove Road, the only main thoroughfare between Shelter Cove and Redway. The Resort Improvement District No. 1 encourages the County to prioritize road maintenance on the section of road between the Mattole bridge and the intersection of Beach Road. We have sustained two areas of major damage on steep, blind curves, where the road is down to single lanes and traffic is being controlled by stop signs. The unprecedented wet winter has greatly impacted this road surface, leaving potholes along its whole length. 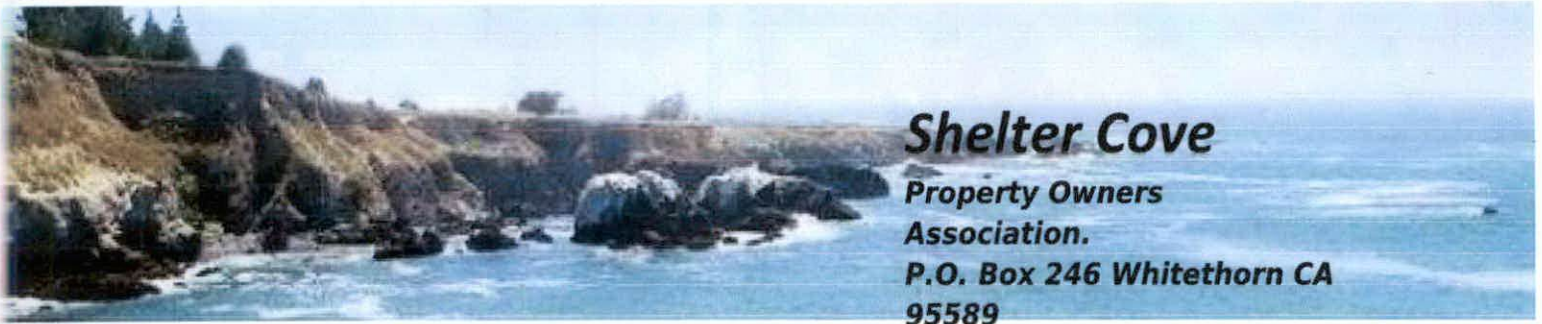

Dear Humboldt County Supervisors,

The board of directors of the Cape Mendocino Lighthouse Preservation Society of Shelter Cove urge the board to direct the Humboldt County Public Works Director to improve the condition of Shelter Cove road by repairing pot holes and slide areas. Shelter Cove road is the only paved road into Shelter Cove.

Obtaining the operational funds to keep the Cape Mendocino Lighthouse open for summer depends on the voluntary donations of visitors. The number of visitors to the lighthouse dropped in the summer of 2017 by over 16% compared to 2016.

As you know my husband and I are in the construction phase of opening the Gyppo Ale Mill, a brewery in Shelter Cove. Opening a business in such a beautiful, yet isolated, area has its challenges. One of those challenges is the use of Shelter Cove Road, the only paved road in and out of the area.

Last winter's torrential downpours did a number on our road and many other roads around Humboldt. I broke a strut in my car hitting a pot hole hidden in the shadows of a tree. My daily commute into town now includes three required sections where I need to stop and wait for traffic to be clear because only one lane is safe to drive in.

## FBI spotlights a crime surge

Violence up 4.1 percent nationwide, up 26.5 percent in Humboldt County

Violent crime in America rose in 2016 for the second straight year, driven by a spike in killings in some major cities, but remained near historically low levels, according to FBI data released Monday.

reported the second-highest number of violent crimes (265 in 2016, topped by 346 reported by the Mendocino County Sheriff's Office) and the highest number of property crimes (773 in 2016, topping 737 reported by the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office), according to the FBI data.

The Humboldt County Sheriff's Office reported in 2016 the state's highest nonmetropolitan numbers in the categories of murder and non-negligent manslaughter, robbery, burglary, and vehicle theft, and its second highest nonmet

The Trump administration immediately seized on the figures as proof that the nation is in the midst of a dangerous crime wave that warrants a return to tougher tactics like more arrests and harsher punishments for drug criminals. But criminologists cautioned the new numbers might not suggest the start of a long-term

ropolitan numbers in the categories of aggravated assault and larceny-theft.

Local Humboldt County agencies listed above reported that property crime rose 9.8 percent in 2016 from the year before, while falling 10.2 percent in 2015 from the previous year.

"This is a frightening trend that threatens to erode so much progress that had made our neighborhoods and communities safer — over 30 years declines in crime are being replaced by increases," Attorney General Jeff Sessions said last week during a speech in Boston. "We cannot accept this as the new normal."

Still, the FBI said it was the first time violent crime rose in consecutive years in more than a decade.

"On Monday, he called upon law enforcement to 'confront and turn back the rising tide of violent crime.' Sessions has used the threat of rising violence as an impetus for many of his sweeping policy changes. He has directed the nation's federal prosecutors to seek tougher sentences against most suspects, including some low level drug offenders and has urged them to focus more intensely on prosecuting gun cases.

Sessions has also been a proponent of the theory that crime has risen as scrutiny of local police has intensified and hurt morale, causing officers to be less aggressive on the streets. As such, he has worked to support the interests of some

homicides climbing 8.6 percent, according to the figures. Violence increased 3.9 percent in 2015, while killings jumped by more than 10 percent.

### Local trends

Violent crimes reported to the FBI from the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, Humboldt State University, and the Arcata, Eureka, Ferndale, Fortuna and Rio Dell police departments rose 26.5

percent in 2016 from the year before, with 12 killings reported. Violence rose 11.6 percent in 2015, with 13 killings reported.

The FBI data included no information from the cities of Blue Lake and Trinidad, which contract with Humboldt County Sheriff's Office for police services.

all yearn for a big picture, national explanation for what's going on that would help us make sense of this, but we don't have one."

But experts remain divided about what caused the rise and about how to respond. Some criminologists believe community distrust in police has made residents less likely to cooperate in investigations, driving up crime.

Two years' worth of data is not enough to show a trend, said Adam Gelb, director of the Public Safety Performance Project of The Pew Charitable Trusts.

"There just aren't any factors that would strongly indicate continued further increases," he said. "We

Despite the increase, the national violent crime rate in 2016 was still down significantly from several years ago. It dropped 18 percent from 2007, and the murder rate was 6 percent lower than it was the same year, according to the data. And it was far from the levels of the 1980s and 1990s, during the height of the drug war, when Sessions was a federal prosecutor in Mobile, Alabama.

Some big cities saw in-

creases in violence while others did not. Chicago, for example, singled out by the White House for its surge in shootings, saw a 60 percent jump in killings from 2015, accounting for more than 20 percent of the nation's increase in murders, according to an analysis of the FBI data by the Brennan Center for Justice at New York University. It found 11 major cities were responsible for driving up the national murder rate.

Regarding: Humboldt County Commercial Cannabis Regulations

Esteemed Supervisors,

Thank-you for your continued dedication to developing common sense regulations that will protect the health of Humboldt County's environment, society, and economy. Today I write to you with a suggestion related to road requirements.

Regarding section 55.4.7 Cannabis Support Facilities of the DRAFT Ordinance Relating to the Commercial Cultivation, Processing, Manufacturing, Distribution, Testing, and Sale of Cannabis for Medical or Adult Use. The section states "Cannabis Support Facilities, including Distribution, Off-Site Processing, Enclosed Nurseries, Community Propagation Centers and Cannabis Testing and Research Laboratories shall be permitted as follows. Roads providing access to the Parcel(s) or Premises must comply with the Road System Performance Standard for Functional Capacity (all segments must either be paved with centerline stripe, or paved meeting the Category 4 standard). Exceptions are prohibited.

In some instances, allowances of Cannabis Support Facilities off of Category 4 standard roads will reduce overall traffic and road use. Use of centralized processing or manufacturing facilities in particular will reduce:

1. The number of round-trips taken from rural farms to urban facilities;
2. The number of trips taken from urban facilities to dispose of residual plant materials;
3. The total number of miles driven to support transportation of unprocessed cannabis materials; and,
4. The total weight of materials moved along roads to support transportation of unprocessed cannabis materials.

Furthermore, movement of residual plant materials off of farms will lead to the depletion of soil nutrients and the continued need to import nutrients. This is due to the nature of plant growth. As plants grow they uptake soil nutrients, if not replaced, overtime soils will become depleted of nutrients. The ideal soil amendments are derived from composted organic materials such as plant matter and animal manure. Rather than push off-site processing and manufacturing away from the farms, I suggest promoting a scenario where the by-products of these activities be composted and returned to farm soils using the least amount of transportation resources as possible.

To this end, I suggest that the exceptions to Category 4 standard roads defined in Humboldt County TITLE III - LAND USE AND DEVELOPMENT DIVISION 11 FIRE SAFE REGULATIONS be allowed. Title III can be found at: <http://www.humboldt.gov.org/DocumentCenter/Home/View/278>.

Caretakers of the land and of the living: **take notice**

A recent article in The Atlantic reveals highly toxic pesticides are being used on greenhouse-grown hemp plants in California, **and the runoff is poisoning forests and rivers.**

The Atlantic article reads:

"Secret growers are taking advantage of the state's remote stretches of public land---and the environmental impact is severe."

"...this past November, Californians voted 'yes' on Proposition 64, making California the fifth state to “**legalize**” recreational cannabis. Almost two-thirds of the country's total **legal** harvest comes from the Golden State...” [poisoned pot shipped everywhere]

"The lethal poisons used to protect the crops and campsites from pests are annihilating wildlife, polluting pristine public lands, and maybe even turning up in your next bong hit."

"...grow sites tested positive for carbofuran, a neurotoxic insecticide that is so nasty it has been banned in America, Canada and the EU. Farmers in Kenya have used it to kill lions. Symptoms of exposure range from nausea and blurred vision to convulsions, spontaneous abortions, and death...."

"Some 50 different toxicants have turned up at grow sites... They use the poisons to keep rodents and other animals from eating the sugar-rich sprouting plants, from gnawing on irrigation tubing, and from invading their campsites in search of food. Acute rodenticides cause neurological damage and internal bleeding. Animals literally drown in their own blood or stumble around until they're eaten themselves, passing the poison up the food chain to predators like owls and fishers."

"'It's a massive problem,' says Craig Thompson, a wildlife ecologist with the U.S. Forest Service. 'People don't tend to grasp the industrial scale of what's going on. There are thousands of these



sites in places the public thinks are pristine, with obscene amounts of chemicals at each one. Each one is an environmental disaster'."

"Gabriel [biologist] and Thompson fear the poisons could spread far beyond each grow site and contaminate the water supply of towns and cities far downstream. The toxicants can leach into the soil and linger for years. Using water monitors, Gabriel has already found organophosphates---nerve agents used to make insecticides and certain types of chemical weapons---several hundred meters downhill from grow sites."

Mark Higley, a wildlife biologist with the Hoopa Tribe in Humboldt County, whose reservation has seen an explosion in grow sites, says, "While there is no proof that the poisoned plants ends up in the burgeoning 'legal' market, many familiar with the industry suspect it does."

"Legal enforcement agents think many of the trespass grows are set up [on public land] by Mexican drug cartels, which prefer to ship marijuana from state to state rather than smuggle it over the border. Persons arrested during raids are often undocumented immigrants in their 20s from Michoacan, experienced in covert agriculture and hard living. They earn around \$150 a day for two-to-four months, much more than they would at a farm or winery."

"Captured immigrants sometimes claim their employers are holding their families hostage until the harvest is collected. Whether or not that's true, they're motivated to protect the crop. Thompson estimates between a quarter and half of raids turn up some kind of weapon, from crossbows to automatic rifles. He has found elevated sniper positions set up near grow sites."

"Just walking through rows of plants coated with toxic chemicals can be enough to bring on symptoms like lethargy and headaches---let alone spending hours cutting them down in the hot sun under the wash of a helicopter. Gabriel [biologist] and his employees have started getting monthly blood tests to check for pesticide exposure."

"Some chemical threats are more immediate. At one site Gabriel was inspecting an unfamiliar container full of aluminum phosphide, a poisonous powder used to kill rodents and insects. It had gasified and built up pressure in the heat of the sun. When he touched it, it exploded in his face."

Luckily he was wearing a hazmat respirator."

"My biggest fear is that some kid will come across one of those bottles," Gabriel says.

'Carbofuran is pink, it looks like Pepto, like candy. Can you imagine what a five-year-old would do with that?'"

So the contamination and the poison are in the land, in the water, in animals, in the cannabis people smoke, and in the manufactured products.

This is not the first time that hemp has been found to contain pesticides. A quick search will turn up a number of articles. However, the level of toxicity here in these California indoor hemp farms is extreme, to say the least.

Where are these growers buying their banned pesticides? Mexico? On the black market?

How can cannabis smokers be sure they're smoking clean product? For example, are 'legal' dispensaries working with proper labs to test many, many samples? In these tests, how many pesticide compounds are covered? How many aren't?

Over time, stories like the one in The Atlantic come and go, and people forget them. But that would be a mistake.

People who use cannabis often reply to stories like this with the claim they know that a great deal of it is pure, and their suppliers are ethical. One hopes that's true, but is it?

If some of these highly contaminated hemp farms in California are run by Mexican drug cartels, don't expect legal enforcement to solve the problem. It isn't going to happen. The determination isn't there.

The corporate governmental employees in the State of California considers the State to be a sanctuary for illegal immigrants. So how are the State persons going to stop some of these immigrants from becoming illegal growers who deploy highly dangerous chemicals on a daily



basis?

As for the California forests and rivers, the public service agencies are far behind the curve. The illegal growers are, in effect, staging wide-ranging random attacks on the environment.

This has nothing to do with a "progressive attitude" toward cannabis. It has everything to do with criminals seeding the land and rivers with poison, and no incentive for oversight is in place.

And it is yet one more consequence of the unchecked and unprosecuted growth of the pesticide industry, in which, over many decades, corporations have been manufacturing and selling all sorts of heinous poisons---"better living through chemistry"--- reversing centuries of agricultural practice that fed populations good clean food.
