Subject: Report of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's Rule 20A Work Credits and Status of Undergrounding Projects

<u>RECOMMENDATION(S)</u>: That the Board of Supervisors receive and file the 2017 Rule 20A Allocation and Work Credit Balance Report from Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E).

SOURCE OF FUNDING: Rule 20A Utility Underground Fund/General Fund

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: The County of Humboldt currently has \$2,240,461 in work credits available through PG&E for undergrounding of overhead utility lines (Attachment 1). The funds are derived from tariffs that are calculated based upon 50% of the number of PG&E's overhead electric meters and 50% of the total electric meters within each community. The funds can only be used for the purpose of undergrounding utilities and only when meeting criteria established by the California Public Utilities Commission.

In 2013, the Board of Supervisors revised the County's Utility Conversion Plan (Attachment 2). The plan identifies future undergrounding projects and prioritizes them. Since that time, one project has been completed. In 2016, the School Road (East) undergrounding project was constructed.

The following projects remain on the Utility Conversion Plan:

\*Estimated project costs are calculated by multiplying the project length by \$500 per linear foot.

Under the current Rule 20A program, time and materials spent by the county inspecting and administering the project are not reimbursable with Rule 20A funds. This is an on-going issue for cities and counties within PG&E's service area. A proposal by PG&E was recently made that would change the program rules to allow the cities and counties to be reimbursed for these expenses from Rule 20A funds. Because of the pending change, the Department of Public Works (Department) has placed the undergrounding projects on hold. All of the cities and counties (with the exception of the City of San Jose who wants additional revisions to the program) within the PG&E service area support the proposed revision. However, because of the opposition by the City of San Jose, the revision to the Rule 20A program has stalled. Because of the costs to the county's General Fund, the Department is continuing to place the undergrounding projects on hold until the Rule 20A program is revised to allow these costs to be reimbursed by Rule 20A funds.

<u>FINANCIAL IMPACT</u>: This item does not impact the General Fund. The item conforms with the Board of Supervisors' Core Role of providing for and maintaining infrastructure as identified in the Board's Strategic Framework.

#### OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT: PG&E

<u>ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS</u>: The Board of Supervisors may direct the Department to move forward with one or more projects and provide General Fund revenue to cover the Department's costs. This alternative is not recommended.

Subject: 2017 Rule 20A Allocation and Work Credit Balance

Dear Public Works Director,

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with an update on your 2017 Rule 20A annual allocation amount and work credit balance. As of March 31, 2017, your work credit balance was \$2,240,461, which includes the 2017 allocation amount of \$346,778. In addition, the work credit balance does not reflect an offset for currently active projects as this work is deducted at the conclusion of the project.

If your community would like to proceed with a Rule 20A project but does not have sufficient work credits, the Rule 20 tariff allows for the use of up to 5-years of future annual allocations. If you would like to elect this option, please let us know and we can further explain the process.

PG&E values its partnership with your community and we look forward to working with you. # Attachment 2 Utility Conversion Plan revised 2013

### UTILITY CONVERSION PLAN revised 2013

The Utility Underground Committee has reviewed the following projects and recommends that the Board of Supervisors revise the Utility Conversion Plan as follows:

- It is understood that this list is in a priority format based upon the information provided at time of its approval. However, some projects may be moved ahead of other projects based upon timing of funding for road improvement projects; the ability of PG&E to work on the project; and the challenges getting the project designed and constructed. If a project becomes stalled, it does not make sense to delay all of the other projects on the list due to challenges with a higher priority project.
- It is understood that this plan is to be reviewed and revised, if necessary, at the same time as the 5year master plan for street improvement projects. This will allow coordination of projects to minimize impacts to the public roads.
- It is understood that this plan may be revised at any time at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors as changes in the priority of road projects and community needs occur.
