RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Captain Ed Wilkinson will retire on April 3, 2018, after 30 years of exemplary public service to the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Custody Services Division; and

WHEREAS, Ed grew up in Southern Humboldt county, graduated from South Fork High and after college pursued a Career in Law Enforcement. On September 9, 2988, Ed was hired by Sheriff David Renner as a Correctional Officer for the old Humboldt County Linear Jail and a year later was promoted to a Correctional Officer II on October 1, 1989. He was then promoted to the position of Classification Officer on March 19, 1990 where he managed the various classification of inmates and conducted various disciplinary hearings on inmate rule violations; and

WHEREAS, Ed was promoted to Senior Correctional Officer on June 21, 1992 where his primary duties was training and preparing for the opening of a new County Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, Ed was selected and transferred to the Transition Team on June 6, 1994. Ed was tasked with the day-to-day operation of planning and implementing new policies and procedure for Phase I of the new Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, Ed was promoted to Correctional Supervisor on March 26, 1995 due to his superior leadership abilities; and

WHEREAS, Ed was selected to attend the first "Training for Trainers" course by the Department of Justice and the National Institute of Corrections in Longmont, Colorado in August of 1996. Ed was looked upon to change the culture of running an old Liner Jail to our current Direct Supervision Model. Ed helped change our perspective of inmate behavior management to a modern progressive approach; and

WHEREAS, Ed was promoted into the management ranks to Correctional Lieutenant on April 5, 1998 and to Correctional Captain on July 15, 2007 by Sheriff Gary Philp. Ed also served on numerous county committees, and has worked closely with the Board of State Community Corrections on many projects and yearly inspections; and

WHEREAS, Ed has numerous "Letters of Commendations," from Supervisors, Law Enforcement Officials, and from local organizations for his service to our community; and

WHEREAS, Ed was always known for his steady leadership and strong core values to the field of Corrections, he was an integral part of the opening of our Phase I and Phase II Correctional Facilities, and continues to assist us with our current SB 863 Humboldt County Community Corrections Reentry Resource Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, Sheriff William Honsal, and the staff of the Custody Services Division hereby commend Captain Ed Wilkinson for his 30 years of service, and together, wish him success in his retirement.
