Recommendations

R6. The Humboldt County Civil Grand Jury recommends Humboldt County Department of Health and Human Services mandate biennial attendance by all staff with direct youth contact at the Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) trainings to be offered regarding special education law, ethics, purpose, and process. This initial training should be completed by December 1, 2018. **(F8)**

Response: DHHS-CWS will implement this recommendation in part. DHHS-CWS commends the Grand Jury for recognizing the importance of special education laws, ethics, and processes to child welfare and agrees that this type of training would be helpful for CWS social workers. The agency will either arrange for the biennial trainings to occur through the SELPA, or through internal trainings coordinated through our agreements with the University of California, Davis.
