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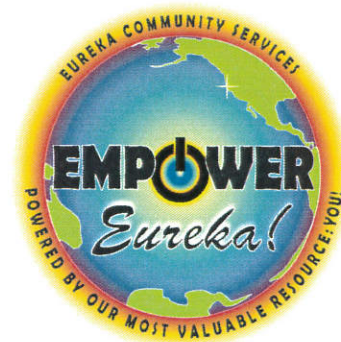
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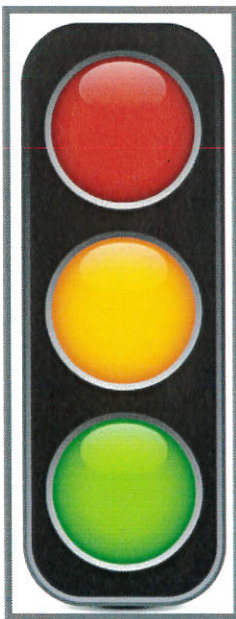
How to utilize this Resource Guide

This resource guide has been designed to serve as a map to assist UPLIFT Eureka participants in navigating the various resources available in our community at the time when they need them and in order of their progress.

The resource guide is broken up into three color coordinated sections, and follow a narrative of available resources that participant can decide if they want or need that particular resource at that point in their journey.

There are three sections of this resource guide that will efficiently help UPLIFT participants navigate where to review resources, what services they offer, when those services are available, and how to contact them.

As you continue to build relationships with your participant, familiarize yourself with where they are in the progress, and frequently review these resources with them to see if they could benefit in their progress by any of them.

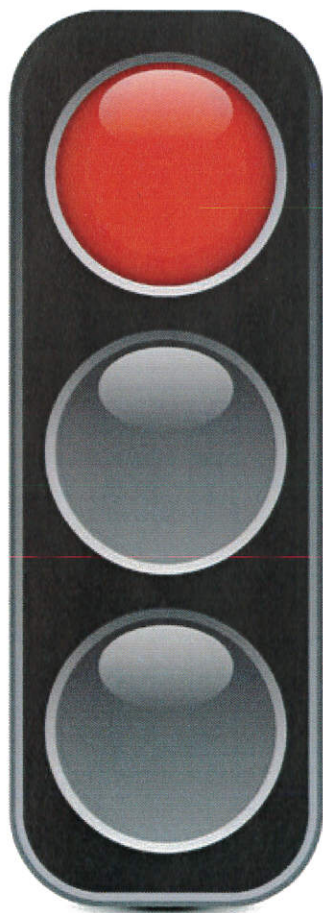


Section One resources, are in **red** and reflect resources that participants should **stop** and address immediately before tackling bigger issues.

Section Two resources, are in **yellow** and reflect resources that should allow participants to **slow down** and address at their pace and need in order to ensure they have proper tools to take advantage of future resources.

Section Three resources, are in **green** and reflect resources that are available to participants once they have met a lot of their own goals and are set up to successfully allow participants to **move forward**.

SECTION ONE: IMMEDIATE NEEDS



Resources in this section are reflective of resources that meet basic survival needs that should be met immediately.

SAFETY



Safety is something that everybody has the right to.

Individuals who may find themselves houseless, have a higher risk of finding themselves in situations where they may feel unsafe either physically, emotionally or health wise.

Talk with the participant about their current situation and listen for potential **safety risks**, and review any and all of the resources with them to assess if one particular resource might be something that could meet their need.
