After compiling the data with the help of consultants, we initiated a Safety Campaign. This Campaign focuses on Highway 36 Road Safety, Social Cohesiveness, and Disaster and Emergency Preparedness. Fire Protection has been a reoccurring and prevalent concern in our community. We are working on educating our residents to be prepared for all disasters, but the dangers we face with regard to fire are increasing as we all have seen in the past years. Working along with our local fire department, CalFire, and OES, we are establishing a more unified emergency preparedness plan in our neighborhoods and for our community as a whole.

Through community meetings and committees we have identified the need for strategic water storage for firefighting as a way to help the community in emergency fire situations. The community is requesting funding for water tanks that would be reserved for wildland fires; potentially in two sites in the Bridgeville area. We are asking for funding for two 5,000 gallon tanks at each site (a total of 4) and some funds for securing and plumbing the tanks as well. With the help of CalFire's Planning Department, input from the Fire Safe Council, and community buy-in, we are working to determine "hot spots" in our area for the proper location of the water tanks. The tanks will be fenced, locked, and will be only used for an emergency wildland fire. CalFire and the Bridgeville Volunteer Fire Department will have access to the water when needed.

Water supply is scarce in our area and the water supply that comes from the CalFire station is not easily accessible and is likely far away from the incident.
