3. Please provide brief description of proposal for which you are seeking funding.

The public defender offices are seeking additional funding for two full time attorneys and three full time support staff in order to meet the increased demand on our offices as a result of increased funding to law enforcement agencies through the passage of Measure Z in 2014. Ultimately, increased efforts by law enforcement agencies result in a direct impact on the public defender's offices as the Public Defender is appointed to represent approx. 90% of all criminal defendants in Humboldt County.

4. How are you developing a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, in order for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future Measure Z funds?

The only available alternatives to meet the increased demand placed on the Public Defender, as a result of increased funding provided to law enforcement through Measure Z are:

- 1. Request additional general funds from the County;
- 2. Reduce services provided by the Public Defender Offices.

5. If this request is for the continuation, or expansion, of an existing program/service, what is the current source of funding for that program/service?

The current source of funding for the Public Defender Offices is County general funds and \$216,657 in Measure Z funding.

6. If you are awarded Measure Z funds, how will you use them to leverage additional grants, contributions, or community support?

There are limited funds available to Public Defender offices; however, with an increase in staff that Measure Z funds can provide, staff will have additional time to continue exploring additional funding from other resources.

7. Will this proposal require new or expanded activity on the part of another entity to be fully functional and effective? If so, please describe.

No. The additional funding will simply allow the public defender's office to meet the increased demand for public defender services as a result of increased Measure Z funding to law enforcement agencies.

Public Defender 2019/20 Measure Z Proposal Narrative

The Humboldt County Public Defender Offices are requesting additional funding in order to meet the increased demand for public defender representation as a direct result of increased activities by law enforcement since the passage of Measure Z in 2014. An efficient public safety unit requires that the Courts, Law Enforcement, and Public Defender operate with adequate resources to address the needs of the community. If one branch of the local public safety unit is weak this impacts the other units significantly.

The Public Defender provides essential county services as each county is required to provide adequate representation to all criminal defendants that cannot afford to hire private counsel. Currently, the Public Defender Offices represent approx. 90% of all criminal defendants arraigned in the Humboldt County Superior court. In addition to the criminal case load, the Public Defender also represents over 210 conservatorship and family law contempt clients appointed by the courts.

Despite significantly increased caseloads and court appearances, Public Defender Office staffing has remained stagnant for over seven years, with the exception of two FTE positions funded by Measure Z during the 2016-17 fiscal year. When compared to the District Attorney's Office the Public Defender Offices (Public Defender and Conflict Counsel combined) have over 50% less full-time employees, and 89% less funding for extra-help staff. The following represents a comparison of staffing and significant funding between the two offices:

In order to provide adequate representation to indigent clients the Public Defender is requesting supplemental measure Z funding in the amount of \$786,138. Combined with the existing Measure Z funding of \$216,637, the total measure Z funding for the Public Defender Offices would total \$1,002,775 for fiscal year 2019/20.

With the proposed addition of one (FTE) Deputy Public Defender and one (FTE) Deputy County Counsel, the Public Defender offices would be better equipped to meet the increasing demand of appearing in multiple courtrooms simultaneously. Currently, neither office has adequate coverage in the event that an attorney is trial, or on leave for more than one week. Inadequate coverage places a burden on the courts and the district attorney's office when they are forced to reset court dates to accommodate the shortage of available public defender attorneys; in addition there is an increased burden placed upon the county jail when incarcerated defendants are held longer as a result of trial dates being postponed to accommodate the shortage of available attorneys.

The addition of three (FTE) legal office assistants (one will be allocated to Conflict Counsel) will allow timely processing of new case files, discovery, and probation reports that are received by the PD offices on a daily basis. Currently, a total of eight (8) support staff are responsible for answering telephones and scheduling appointments for over 1800 current clients and supporting 15 attorneys by drafting motions, judicial council forms, and correspondence. Daily tasks include: retrieving and filing documents with the courts, opening new case files (up to 40 per day), scanning and filing all incoming and outgoing documents, pulling case files for court appearances, printing court calendars and assigning attorneys/case files to corresponding courtrooms, tracking expenditures for over 200 conservatorship clients, and processing the incoming and outgoing daily mail. With the existing personnel allocation of eight (8) support they continually work with a growing backlog that force them to worth through lunch periods and set aside critical functions.
