### **Proposal Narrative**

The families in our county and country are in perilous decline due in a large degree to drug and alcohol abuse. In Humboldt County alone there are at at least 300 children a year in foster care. The primary cause for the a child's removal from their homes is neglect and abuse that is directly related to parental misuse and abuse of drugs and alcohol, and, subsequently, the breakdown of the family unit.

The good news is that great programs available here in Humboldt County such as *Adult and Teen Challenge* and *Mountain of Mercy Mission Farm* that address these treatment needs. At these facilities men and women are given the tools to break free from all forms of debilitating addictions and life controlling issues.

We have witnessed the restoration and renewal in so many aspects of the graduates' lives. The graduates complete these programs and are excited and anxious to reconnect with their families and re-enter the community as restored, responsible citizens. Unfortunately, what we have also observed is that while the graduates of these programs have this new freedom and a strong desire to move on with their lives, they often don't have the skills, tools, finances and/or proper conditions in which to make this a reality.

Of these many challenges, an area of concern that we have observed involves the process of reconnecting mothers with their children. While the mothers are in recovery the children are usually living in foster care or with a family member or friend. After the mothers are rehabilitated there is often no place that is suitable for a successful reunification with their children. These mothers and children have already suffered as a result of their past--often tumultuous lives-- and have lost precious time together. It is imperative that no more valuable time in their relationships is lost.

Mercy's Haven, Inc. seeks to provide a supportive and safe environment for single mothers to be reunited with their children to ensure a smoother transition back into the community and productive living. Mercy's Haven is a bridge residential program which offers a variety of classes and opportunities to learn life skills that are important to be successful in the community and resist falling back into destructive patterns of addiction leaving their children at risk. Many children of single parent homes end up in detention facilities and needing extra services due to delinquency as the statistics show. Mercy's Haven is seeking to help with this problem through a supported and safe environment where they can grow, learn, thrive and eventually succeed independently.
