RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Adopt the resolution authorizing the Director of Public Health to apply for funding for the next five fiscal years (2014-15 through 2018-19) from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) and to enter into and execute grant agreements and grant agreement amendments with CalRecycle for DEH's LEA program, in Fund 1175, Budget Unit 430.
- 2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to return one certified original, signed copy of the resolution to Public Health Administration.

DISCUSSION:

The Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health's Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) program has applied for and has been awarded grant money annually from CalRecycle (formerly California Integrated Waste Management Board) since 1991 to enhance solid waste facility permitting and inspection. The Humboldt County Board of Supervisors previously approved Resolution No. 09-36 on June 9, 2009 (Attachment 2). These grant funds will be incorporated into the LEA Program's budgets for the next five fiscal years. In addition to the Enforcement Assistance grant, LEA receives revenue through the Humboldt Waste Management Authority from solid waste disposal tipping fees as well as permitted facility fees to support the various activities within the program.

The Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health, Division of Environmental Health is requesting the Board give the Public Health Director the authority to apply for this grant funding for fiscal years 2014-15 through 2018-19. Additionally, the resolution will authorized the Director of Public Health to execute all applications, agreements, contracts, requests for payment and amendments for securing Enforcement Assistance grants. CalRecycle has requested a multi-year term resolution that is limited to five years.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Adoption of this resolution will give Public Health the ability to apply for Enforcement Assistance grant funds for the next five years. These funds will be included in the LEA's budget, fund 1175, budget unit 430, fiscal years 2014-15 through 2018-19. The grant funds provide an additional \$18,000 to \$20,000 per year to support salary and training costs for LEA program staff. No matching funds are required and there is no impact on Humboldt County's General Fund.

The LEA program supports the Board's Strategic Framework by creating opportunities for improved safety and health.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board could choose not to approve this resolution. This is not recommended, as the loss of funding would result in the full burden of staff time and training costs to fall on revenues collected from tipping and facility fees.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC HEALTH TO SIGN AND SUBMIT ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE GRANT APPLICATIONS FOR FISCAL YEARS 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19.

WHEREAS, The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) has determined that the Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health is eligible to receive funds from their noncompetitive grant program to assist Local Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) in carrying out their solid waste facilities permit and inspection programs, pursuant to Public Resources Code, section 43230; and

WHEREAS, the Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health will use these funds for activities related to solid waste facility permit and inspection programs; and

WHEREAS, the Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health is authorized to enter into a financial assistance agreement with CalRecycle; and

WHEREAS, the Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health desires the Director of Public Health or the Director's designee to serve as the representative for the County of Humboldt for purposes of the CalRecycle Grant Program.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Public Health or the Director's designee to enter into a financial assistance agreement with CalRecycle for the solid waste facility permit and inspection programs and to execute any agreements, amendments, invoices or other documents related to or required for the administration of said agreement and to comply with all applicable federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements related to any financial assistance funds received.

WHEREAS, the California Integrated Waste Management Board has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program within the state, setting up necessary procedures governing application by cities and counties under the program; and

WHEREAS, the applicant demonstrates it has sufficient staff resources, technical expertise, and/or experience with similar projects to carry out the proposed program; and

WHEREAS, the applicant will enter into an agreement with the State of California for implementation of an Enforcement Assistance Grant.
