


Low traceability:



#### **Benefits for Humboldt County**

- Significant economic development benefits will be realized



- Diversification of the local seafood economy and synergies with existing seafood industry in the County
- At least 80 direct jobs, plus many indirect jobs (i.e. construction)
- Local workforce development activities / work with local academic institutions
- Approx. 400 mill USD local investment and tax revenue
- 200 million USD in annual revenues when fully developed
- · Clean-up of a brown-field problem
- An anchor tenant for green development on the Samoa Peninsula

#### Identified challenges in the Humboldt location

- · Local fresh- and seawater requires rigorous treatment to meet aquaculture standards
- Demolition and clean-up costs of the site will be significant, with potential unknown risks
- Permitting in California can be unpredictable and costly a risk for the project
- Extra costs related to tsunami risk
- · High energy costs compared to alternative locations
- · Somewhat isolated location potential transport issues, particularly if roads close

The effect of these various issues may significantly raise capital cost, increase project timelines, and increase local production cost. Business disruption is also a risk we are assessing.



#### Financial incentives

- mitigation of local risks and show-stoppers for the project

Moving forward involves establishing that a competitive project can be developed in Humboldt.

Financial incentives/funding are needed for two key risk and potential "no-go" areas:

- 1) Secure infrastructure for the Water District to deliver clean water to the Peninsula. The available surface water has high and variable turbidity. Cost of water to be clarified.
- 2) Brown-field clean-up with unknown risks and costs.


The above are local risks that our projects normally would not have to deal with, and thus we would not incur costs on.

Our request is specifically related to risk and cost alleviation related to these issues.


We appreciate that the County has established a taskforce (REDI), and the County's continued support for this project.




### What are recirculating aquaculture systems (RAS)?

We searched the entire Western coastline in 2018 for a site based on high-level criteria\*

## Logistical requirements

- 1. Seawater source (<1,500 m away)
- 2. Freshwater source (clean, 1,600 gpm)
- 3. Deepwater discharge location (well-mixed)

- 4. Operational criteria
  - a. Energy (3phase power supply)
- b. Transportation (marine, ground, air)
- c. Stable, appropriate water temperature
  - d. Site layout (size, topography)

- 5. Regulatory criteria
- a. Economic Opportunity Zone
- b. No related impairments in receiving waters
- c. Compatible zoning

- 6. Community features
  - a. Labor force, local college
    - b. "Livable" community
- c. Maritime/
- d. Supportive of development projects

#### Strengths of the Somoa site

- · Fresh- and seawater access
- · Existing outfall pipe
- Substation on site
- Existing zoning for aquaculture
- Mid-coast location
- Available property
- HSU resources in town
- Community positive to development

Based on negotiations, Humboldt was chosen as the finalist to complete due diligence.



#### Key facts about the proposed facility

- · Main development area is approx. 30 acres
  - 5 production modules
  - Hatchery
  - · Fish processing
  - Waste water treatment
  - · Other support functions
- An additional 20 acre solar power park to be added - looking at options now
- · Due diligence planned complete in August
- Engineering and permitting to start this fall, provided acceptable due diligence outcome

#### Investment decision to follow due diligence phase

2019

- Brown-field clean-up scope
- Demolition of existing structures
- Fresh- and seawater quality
- Tsunami and seismic assessments
- Planning of permitting process

September 2019

Provided satisfactory due diligence results, we will move into permitting this fall.

2019/2020

- · Establish offices in Humboldt
- · Facility lay-out & design
- · Site civil engineering
- CEQA process + assessments
- Submission of permit applications
