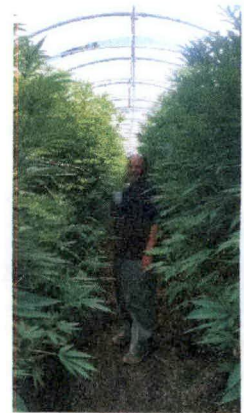
Cannabis Micro-Grant Advisory Committee
