MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BY AND BETWEEN COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AND CITY OF FORTUNA

CITY OF FORTUNA FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU"), entered into this ____ day of _____, 2019, by and between the County of Humboldt, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY," and the City of Fortuna, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," is made upon the following considerations:

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 26227 provides that the board of supervisors of any county may appropriate and expend money from the county's general fund to finance programs deemed to be necessary to meet the social needs of the population of the county, including, without limitation, the areas of health, law enforcement and public safety; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY placed a one-half (.5) cent local sales and use tax measure, known as "Measure Z." on the November 2014 ballot to maintain and improve essential services; and

WHEREAS, Measure Z was passed by the voters of Humboldt County on November 4, 2014 and became operative on April 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, due to the passage of Measure Z, COUNTY has additional funding to maintain and improve essential services, including, without limitation: law enforcement services; emergency response services; illegal cannabis cultivation enforcement and prevention; child abuse enforcement and prevention; crime investigation and prosecution; substance abuse rehabilitation; mental health treatment; rural fire protection, road repairs; and other necessary services relating to the areas of health, law enforcement and public safety; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY created a nine (9) member Citizens Advisory Committee to review Measure Z funding applications and make recommendations to the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2019, CITY submitted a Measure Z application, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A – Applications for Measure Z Funding – and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full, to the Citizens' Advisory Committee requesting an allocation in the amount of One Hundred Eighty-One Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$181,577.00) for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses associated with assigning one (1) full-time equivalent police officer to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2019, CITY submitted a Measure Z application, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A – Applications for Measure Z Funding – and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full, to the Citizens' Advisory Committee requesting an allocation in the amount of One Hundred Eighty-Six Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$186,577.00) for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses associated with assigning one (1) full-time equivalent school resource officer to the elementary and high schools located within the Eel River Valley area of Humboldt County,; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2019, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors approved the Measure Z applications submitted by CITY in the amount of Three Hundred Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$311,000.00) through June 30, 2020.

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WHEREAS, COUNTY and CITY desire to enter into an agreement which sets forth each party's rights and responsibilities regarding the expenditure of Measure Z funds allocated to CITY.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. COUNTY OBLIGATIONS:

- A. <u>Payment for Drug Enforcement Services</u>. COUNTY shall provide CITY with an amount not to exceed One Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$148,000.00) for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses associated with assigning one (1) full-time equivalent police officer to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force.
- B. Payment for Truancy and School Safety Services. COUNTY shall provide CITY with an amount not to exceed One Hundred Sixty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$163,000.00) for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses associated with assigning one (1) full-time equivalent school resource officer to the elementary and high schools located within the Eel River Valley area of Humboldt County.

2. CITY OBLIGATIONS:

- A. <u>Drug Enforcement Services</u>. CITY shall continue to assign one (1) full-time equivalent police officer to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force to assist in drug enforcement operations throughout Humboldt County.
- B. <u>Truancy and School Safety Services</u>. CITY shall continue to assign one (1) full-time equivalent school resource officer to the elementary and high schools located within the Eel River Valley area of Humboldt County to assist with truancy and school safety.
- C. Quarterly and Final Reports. CITY shall provide quarterly and final reports to COUNTY as set forth in Exhibit B Quarterly and Final Summary Reports which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. Any and all quarterly and final reports required hereunder shall be prepared using COUNTY's standard Measure Z report form, which is attached hereto as Exhibit C Quarterly and Final Report Form and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.
- D. <u>Social Media</u>. CITY shall post summaries of the information contained in the quarterly and final reports submitted pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU on CITY-maintained social media accounts as set forth in Exhibit D Social Media Reporting Requirements which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. For purposes of this MOU, social media includes, without limitation, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Snapchat.
- E. <u>Recognition of Measure Z Funding</u>. CITY shall cooperate with COUNTY efforts to recognize Measure Z funding. Such recognition may take the form of press releases, photos and adhesives to equipment.

3. <u>TERM</u>:

This MOU shall begin on July 1, 2019 and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30, 2020, unless sooner terminated as provided herein.

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4. TERMINATION:

- A. <u>Termination for Cause</u>. COUNTY may, in its sole discretion, immediately terminate this MOU, if CITY fails to adequately fulfill its obligations hereunder within the time limits specified herein, fails to comply with the terms or conditions set forth herein, or violates any local, state of federal law, regulation or standard applicable to its performance hereunder.
- B. <u>Termination without Cause</u>. COUNTY may terminate this MOU without cause upon thirty (30) days advance written notice which states the effective date of the termination.
- C. <u>Termination due to Insufficient Funding</u>. COUNTY's obligations under this MOU are contingent upon the availability of local funding resulting from the sales and use tax established by Measure Z. In the event such funding is reduced or eliminated, COUNTY shall, at its sole discretion, determine whether this MOU shall be terminated. COUNTY shall provide CITY seven (7) days advance written notice of its intent to terminate this MOU due to insufficient funding.
- D. <u>Compensation upon Termination</u>. In the event this MOU is terminated, CITY shall be entitled to compensation for uncompensated costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU through and including the effective date of such termination. However, this provision shall not limit or reduce any damages owed to COUNTY due to a breach of this MOU by CITY.

5. COMPENSATION:

- A. <u>Maximum Amount Payable</u>. The maximum amount payable by COUNTY for the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU is Three Hundred Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$311,000.00). CITY agrees to perform all of its obligations hereunder for an amount not to exceed such maximum dollar amount. However, if the allocation of local funding resulting from the sales and use tax established by Measure Z is reduced or eliminated, COUNTY may, by amendment, reduce the maximum amount payable hereunder or terminate this MOU as provided herein.
- B. <u>Schedule of Rates</u>. CITY shall set forth the specific rates and costs applicable to this MOU using COUNTY's standard Measure Z budget form, which is attached hereto as Exhibit E Schedule of Rates and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.
- C. <u>Additional Costs and Expenses</u>. Any additional costs and expenses not otherwise provided for herein shall not be incurred by CITY, or compensated by COUNTY, without written authorization by COUNTY. Any and all unauthorized costs and expenses incurred above the maximum payable amount set forth herein shall be the responsibility of CITY. CITY shall notify COUNTY, in writing, at least six (6) weeks prior to the date upon which CITY estimates that the maximum payable amount will be reached.

6. <u>PAYMENT</u>:

CITY shall submit to COUNTY quarterly invoices itemizing all costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU. Invoices shall be in the format set forth in Exhibit F – Measure Z Invoice Form – which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. CITY shall submit a final undisputed invoice for payment within thirty (30) days following the expiration or termination of this MOU. Payment for the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be made within thirty (30) days after the

receipt of approved invoices. Any and all invoices submitted pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be sent to COUNTY at the following address:

7. NOTICES:

Any and all notices required to be given pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the respective addresses set forth below. Notice shall be effective upon actual receipt or refusal as shown on the receipt obtained pursuant to the foregoing.

8. RECORD RETENTION AND INSPECTION:

- A. <u>Maintenance and Preservation of Records</u>. CITY agrees to timely prepare accurate and complete financial, performance and payroll records, documents and other evidence relating to the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, and to maintain and preserve said records for at least three (3) years from the date of final payment hereunder, except that if any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other action is pending, the records shall be retained until completion and resolution of all issues arising therefrom. Such records shall be original entry books with a general ledger itemizing all debits and credits for the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU.
- B. <u>Inspection of Records</u>. Pursuant to California Government Code Section 8546.7, all records, documents, conditions and activities of CITY, and its subcontractors, related to the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, shall be subject to the examination and audit of the California State Auditor and any other duly authorized agents of the State of California for a period of three (3) years after the date of final payment hereunder. CITY hereby agrees to make all such records available during normal business hours to inspection, audit and reproduction by COUNTY and any other duly authorized local, state and/or federal agencies. CITY further agrees to allow interviews of any of its employees who might reasonably have information related to such records by COUNTY and any other duly authorized local, state and/or federal agencies. All examinations and audits conducted hereunder shall be strictly confined to those matters connected with the performance of this MOU, including, without limitation, the costs of administering this MOU.
- C. <u>Audit Costs</u>. In the event of an audit exception or exceptions related to the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, the party responsible for not meeting the requirements set forth herein shall be responsible for the deficiency and for the cost of such

audit. If the allowable expenditures cannot be determined because CITY's documentation is nonexistent or inadequate, according to generally accepted accounting practices, the questionable cost shall be disallowed by COUNTY.

9. <u>MONITORING</u>:

CITY agrees that COUNTY has the right to monitor all activities related to this MOU, including, without limitation, the right to review and monitor CITY's records, policies, procedures and overall business operations, at any time, in order to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of this MOU. CITY will cooperate with a corrective action plan, if deficiencies in CITY's records, policies, procedures or overall performance hereunder are identified by COUNTY. However, COUNTY is not responsible, and will not be held accountable, for overseeing or evaluating the adequacy of CITY's performance hereunder.

10. <u>CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION</u>:

- A. <u>Disclosure of Confidential Information</u>. In the performance of this MOU, CITY may receive information that is confidential under local, state or federal law. CITY hereby agrees to protect all confidential information in conformance with any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations, policies, procedures and standards, including, without limitation: California Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 827, 5328, 10850 and 14100.2; California Health and Safety Code Sections 1280.15 and 1280.18; the California Information Practices Act of 1977; the California Confidentiality of Medical Information Act ("CMIA"); the United States Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act ("HITECH Act"); the United States Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and any current and future implementing regulations promulgated thereunder, including, but not limited to, the Federal Privacy Regulations contained in Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R.") Parts 160 and 164, the Federal Security Standards contained in 45 C.F.R. Parts 160, 162 and 164 and the Federal Standards for Electronic Transactions contained in 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 162, all as may be amended from time to time.
- B. <u>Continuing Compliance with Confidentiality Requirements</u>. Each party hereby acknowledges that local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards pertaining to confidentiality, electronic data security and privacy are rapidly evolving and that amendment of this MOU may be required to ensure compliance with such developments. Each party agrees to promptly enter into negotiations concerning an amendment to this MOU embodying written assurances consistent with the requirements of HIPAA, the HITECH Act, the CMIA and any other applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations or standards.

11. NON-DISCRIMINATION COMPLIANCE:

A. <u>Professional Services and Employment</u>. In connection with the execution of this MOU, CITY, and its subcontractors, shall not unlawfully discriminate in the provision of professional services or against any employee or applicant for employment because of: race; religion or religious creed; color; age (over forty (40) years of age); sex, including, without limitation, gender identity and expression, pregnancy, childbirth and related medical conditions; sexual orientation, including, without limitation, heterosexuality, homosexuality and bisexuality; national origin; ancestry; marital status; medical condition, including, without limitation, cancer and genetic characteristics; mental or physical disability, including, without limitation, HIV status and AIDS; political affiliation; military service; denial of family care leave; or any other classifications protected by any applicable local, state or federal laws, regulations or standards. Nothing herein shall be construed to require employment of unqualified persons.

B. Compliance with Anti-Discrimination Laws. CITY further assures that it, and its subcontractors, shall abide by the applicable provisions of: Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975; the Food Stamp Act of 1977; Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the California Fair Employment and Housing Act; California Civil Code Sections 51, et seq.; California Government Code Sections 4450, et seq.; California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 10000; Division 21 of the California Department of Social Services Manual of Policies and Procedures; United States Executive Order 11246, as amended and supplemented by United States Executive Order 11375 and 41 C.F.R. Part 60; and any other applicable local, state and/or federal laws, regulations and standards, all as may be amended from time to time. The applicable regulations of the California Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing California Government Code Section 12990, set forth in Sections 8101, et seq. of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

12. NUCLEAR-FREE HUMBOLDT COUNTY ORDINANCE COMPLIANCE:

By executing this MOU, CITY certifies that it is not a Nuclear Weapons Contractor, in that CITY is not knowingly or intentionally engaged in the research, development, production or testing of nuclear warheads, nuclear weapons systems or nuclear weapons components as defined by the Nuclear-Free Humboldt County Ordinance. CITY agrees to notify COUNTY immediately if it becomes a Nuclear Weapons Contractor as defined above. COUNTY may immediately terminate this MOU if it determines that the foregoing certification is false or if CITY subsequently becomes a Nuclear Weapons Contractor.

13. INDEMNIFICATION:

- A. <u>Hold Harmless, Defense and Indemnification</u>. CITY shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify COUNTY and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, liabilities, expenses and costs of any kind or nature, including, without limitation, attorney's fees and other costs of litigation, arising out of, or in connection with, CITY's negligent performance of, or failure to comply with, any of the duties and/or obligations contained herein, except such loss or damage which was caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of COUNTY.
- B. <u>Effect of Insurance</u>. Acceptance of the insurance required by this MOU shall not relieve CITY from liability under this provision. This provision shall apply to all claims for damages related to CITY's performance hereunder, regardless of whether any insurance is applicable or not. The insurance policy limits set forth herein shall not act as a limitation upon the amount of indemnification or defense to be provided by CITY hereunder.

14. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

This MOU shall not be executed by COUNTY, and CITY is not entitled to any rights hereunder, unless certificates of insurance, or other sufficient proof that the following provisions have been complied with, are filed with the Clerk of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors.

A. General Insurance Requirements. Without limiting CITY's indemnification obligations set forth herein, CITY, and its subcontractors, shall take out and maintain, throughout the entire term of this MOU, and any extensions thereof, the following policies of insurance placed with insurers authorized to do business in the State of California and with a current A.M. Bests rating of no less than A: VII or its equivalent against personal injury, death and property damage which may arise from, the activities of CITY or its agents, officers, directors, employees or subcontractors:

- 1. Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability Coverage (occurrence form CG 0001), in an amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence for any one (1) incident, including, without limitation, personal injury, death and property damage. If a general aggregate limit is used, such limit shall apply separately hereto or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
- 2. Automobile/Motor Liability Insurance with a limit of liability of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limit coverage. Such insurance shall include coverage of all owned, hired and non-owned vehicles, and be at least as broad as Insurance Service Office Form Code 1 (any auto).
- 3. Workers' Compensation Insurance, as required by the California Labor Code, with statutory limits, and Employers Liability Insurance with a limit of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per accident for bodily injury or disease. Said policy shall contain, or be endorsed to contain, a waiver of subrogation against COUNTY and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers.
- 4. Professional Liability Insurance Error and Omission Coverage including coverage in an amount no less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for each occurrence (Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) general aggregate). Said insurance shall be maintained for the statutory period during which CITY may be exposed to liability regarding the performance of its obligations hereunder. CITY shall require that such coverage be incorporated into its professional services agreements with any other entities.
- B. <u>Special Insurance Requirements</u>. Said policies shall, unless otherwise specified herein, be endorsed with the following provisions:
 - 1. The Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Policy shall provide that COUNTY, and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers, are covered as additional insured for liability arising out of the operations performed by or on behalf of CITY. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to COUNTY or its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers. Said policy shall also contain a provision stating that such coverage:
 - a. Includes contractual liability.
 - b. Does not contain exclusions as to property damage caused by explosion or collapse of structures or underground damage, commonly referred to as "XCU Hazards."
 - c. Is the primary insurance with regard to COUNTY.
 - d. Does not contain a pro-rata, excess only and/or escape clause.
 - e. Contains a cross liability, severability of interest or separation of insureds clause.
 - 2. The above-referenced policies shall not be canceled, non-renewed or materially reduced in coverage without thirty (30) days prior written notice being provided to COUNTY in accordance with the notice requirements set forth herein. It is further understood that CITY shall not terminate such coverage until COUNTY receives adequate proof that equal or better insurance has been secured.

- 3. The inclusion of more than one (1) insured shall not operate to impair the rights of one (1) insured against another insured, and the coverage afforded shall apply as though separate policies had been issued to each insured, but the inclusion of more than one (1) insured shall not operate to increase the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 4. For claims related to this MOU, CITY's insurance is the primary coverage to COUNTY, and any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained thereby are excess to CITY's insurance and will not be used to contribute therewith.
- 5. Any failure to comply with the provisions of this MOU shall not affect the coverage provided to COUNTY or its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers.
- 6. CITY shall furnish COUNTY with certificates and original endorsements effecting the required coverage prior to execution of this MOU. The endorsements shall be on forms approved by the Humboldt County Risk Manager. Any deductible or self-insured retention over One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be disclosed to, and approved by, COUNTY. If CITY does not keep all required policies in full force and effect, COUNTY may, in addition to any other available remedies, take out the necessary insurance and deduct the cost of said insurance from the monies owed to CITY under this MOU.
- 7. COUNTY is to be notified immediately if twenty-five percent (25%) or more of any required insurance aggregate limit is encumbered, and CITY shall be required to purchase additional coverage to meet the above-referenced aggregate limits.
- C. <u>Insurance Notices</u>. Any and all insurance notices required to be given pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be sent to the addresses set forth below in accordance with the notice requirements contained herein.

15. <u>RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES:</u>

It is understood that this MOU is by and between two (2) independent entities and is not intended to, and shall not be construed to, create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture, or any other similar association. Both parties further agree that CITY shall not be entitled to any benefits to which COUNTY employees are entitled, including, without limitation, overtime, retirement, leave or workers' compensation benefits. CITY shall be solely responsible for the acts or omissions of its agents, officers, employees, assignees and subcontractors.

16. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS:

A. <u>General Legal Requirements</u>. CITY agrees to comply with any and all local, state and federal laws, regulations, policies, procedures and standards applicable to its performance hereunder.

- B. <u>Licensure Requirements</u>. CITY agrees to comply with any and all local, state and federal licensure, certification and accreditation requirements applicable to its performance hereunder.
- C. <u>Accessibility Requirements</u>. CITY agrees to comply with any and all applicable accessibility requirements set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act, Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, California Government Code Section 1135 and any current and future implementing regulations, policies, procedures and standards promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the federal accessibility standards set forth in 36 C.F.R. Section 1194.1, all as may be amended from time to time.
- D. <u>Conflict of Interest Requirements</u>. CITY agrees to comply with any and all applicable conflict of interest requirements set forth in the California Political Reform Act and any current and future implementing regulations, policies, procedures and standards promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the County of Humboldt's Conflict of Interest Code, all as may be amended from time to time.

17. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW:

This MOU is subject to any additional local, state and federal restrictions, limitations or conditions that may affect the terms, conditions or funding of this MOU. This MOU shall be read and enforced as though all legally required provisions are included herein, and if any such provision is not included, or is not correctly stated, the parties agree to amend this MOU to make such insertion or correction.

18. REFERENCE TO LAWS, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS:

In the event any law, regulation or standard referred to herein is amended during the term of this MOU, the parties agree to comply with the amended provision as of the effective date thereof.

19. SEVERABILITY:

If any provision of this MOU, or any portion thereof, is found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, such provision shall be severable and shall not in any way impair the enforceability of any other provision of this MOU.

20. ASSIGNMENT:

Neither party shall delegate its duties nor assign its rights hereunder, either in whole or in part, without the other party's prior written consent. Any assignment by either party in violation of this provision shall be void, and shall be cause for immediate termination of this MOU. This provision shall not be applicable to service agreements or other arrangements usually or customarily entered into by either party to obtain supplies, technical support or professional services.

21. AGREEMENT SHALL BIND SUCCESSORS:

All provisions of this MOU shall be fully binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties and to each of their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and permitted assigns.

22. WAIVER OF DEFAULT:

The waiver by either party of any breach of this MOU shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any such breach in the future, or of the breach of any other requirement of this MOU. In no event shall any payment by COUNTY constitute a waiver of any breach of this MOU which may then exist on the

part of CITY. Nor shall such payment impair or prejudice any remedy available to COUNTY with respect to any breach or default. COUNTY shall have the right to demand repayment of, and CITY shall promptly refund, any funds disbursed to CITY which COUNTY determines were not expended in accordance with the terms of this MOU.

23. AMENDMENT:

CITY shall obtain prior written approval from COUNTY before subcontracting any of the obligations set forth herein. Any and all subcontracts shall be subject to all applicable terms and conditions of

this MOU, including, without limitation, the licensing, certification and confidentiality requirements set forth herein. CITY shall remain legally responsible for the performance of all terms and conditions of this MOU, including, without limitation, any and all services provided by third parties under subcontracts, whether approved by COUNTY or not.

City of Fortuna Police Proposal Narrative:

The Fortuna Police Department is very proud of the working relationships we have fostered with many county agencies. The Fortuna Police Department works very closely with the Humboldt County Sheriff's Department, Humboldt County District Attorney's Office, Mental Health, County Probation and many other county agencies.

Upon inception of Measure Z the City Finance Department estimated that Measure Z would generate roughly \$1,000,000 per year within the City Limits of Fortuna. The City of Fortuna is the fastest growing incorporated city in Humboldt County and the police department has seen the total number of calls for service almost double in the past twelve years, from roughly 11,000 CFS in 2005 to over 24,000 CFS in 2018. With a city population of nearly 13,000, the City of Fortuna serves as the "hub" of the Eel River Valley as the major shopping and business center for the area.

Currently the FPD has a sworn Police Officer assigned as a full-time School Resource Officer, funded by Measure Z. This position serves as a resource for all of the high schools and elementary schools in the Eel River Valley and is based out of Fortuna Union High School, where FUHS has provided office space. Currently the FUHS district has approximately 1,000 students attending FUHS and East High School. The FUHS district services an area approximately 100 square miles, which includes the communities of Fortuna, Rio Dell, Scotia, Loleta, Hydesville, Bridgeville and Carlotta. The six Elementary and Middle schools in the City of Fortuna have a student population of roughly 1,500, the Rio Dell School District has a student population of over 600, Scotia has about 200 students and does Hydesville, Cuddyback Elementary in Carlota has 150 students and Loleta Elementary has about 100 students. The Ferndale Unified School District, which encompasses Ferndale High School and Ferndale Elementary School, services roughly 500 students. All together, our SRO provides services for over 4,200 students in the ERV.

In July 2017, The Fortuna Police Department selected Officer Lindsey Frank as the Measure Z funded School Resource Officer for the Eel River Valley (ERV), a position she still holds today. SRO Frank has attended specialized training and has made outreach to every Elementary, Middle and High School in the ERV. As the 2018 school year started, SRO Frank endeavored on an assessment process on how to provide the best services to all of the schools and took an approach that is custom fit to each school. Officer Frank has attended PTA meetings, School Board meetings and has met with Teachers, Administrators and Staff to gain the needed familiarity of each school to best function as an SRO. The response from all of the schools in the ERV has been overwhelming in their appreciation and support of SRO Frank and the FPD hears regularly that she is making a difference in the lives of students.

SRO Frank has accomplished a great deal in the last year as the SRO, which will be, highlighted in **Attachment #2** *Prior year Results*. SRO Frank has become a "go to" resource for all ERV schools and is truly a mentor to all students from grades K to 12. From being present daily in the schools, attending school events, starting new educational programs, parental assistance programs, making schools safer by providing an armed uniformed presence, drug intervention and enforcement and conflict counselling, Measure Z funding for this position as absolutely made a huge positive difference in the lives of youth in the ERV.

The cost to continue to provide this sworn police officer as the ERV School Resource Officer with salary, benefits and outfitting, is approximately \$186,577 per year. The Fortuna Police Department hopes to keep

this vital position in place and looks forward to continuing this relationship with the County and Measure Z, making all of Humboldt County a safer and better place to live, work and enjoy.

City of Fortuna Police Proposal Prior Year Results:

The Fortuna Police Department was very fortunate to receive funding through Measure Z for fiscal year 2018 / 2019. Measure Z funding was provided to the City of Fortuna to assign a sworn police officer as a School Resource Officer for the Eel River Valley, which encompasses over 100 square miles. With Measure Z funding, a Fortuna Police Officer has been assigned as an SRO since July 8, 2017.

Officer Lindsey Frank has held this position since July 2017. Officer Frank has attended a week long National Association of School Resource Officer's training in Dublin, CA and she attended a week long Peace Officer's Standards and Training (POST) School Resource Officer training in Sacramento.

As the 2018/2019, school year began, SRO Frank provided outreach to all of the schools in the Eel River Valley, had meetings with Teachers and Administrators to conduct an assessment on each schools needs and how to deliver the best service to every school, just as she had done the previous year.

SRO Frank has embraced the role of being a mentor to our youth; SRO Frank has seen a dramatic increase in working with school staff by mentoring and counselling students that suffer from mental health issues.

In the past year, our SRO has been active in the Student Attendance Review Board, focusing on truancy issues and conducting home visits of offending youth. SRO Frank has also worked with Hydesville Elementary and Loleta Elementary on attendance issues in those schools. SRO Frank has taken the lead on implementing the "Parent Project", which has given parents the tools to deal with unruly student behavior in the home and at school. SRO Frank is currently teaching classes from K to 12 on issues of Street Safety, School Safety, Drugs, Anti-Bullying and the effects of alcohol and drugs use in teens.

SRO Frank has responded to a <u>REAL</u> lockdown of campus and kept everyone calm and safe. SRO Frank is has organized training for active shooter training and is coordinating with local law enforcement, sheriff's office, fire and EMS on conducting drills together.

In 2018 the FPD responded to over 500 calls for service at a Fortuna schools. The majority of these calls were handled by SRO Frank. SRO Frank has identified, investigated and arrested students selling drugs. She provides an armed uniformed police presence in ERV schools but is also approachable, a mentor, counsellor and role model to students and youth. She is present at most school sporting events and assemblies and interacts with students on a daily basis.

SRO Frank is a serving as a guiding force for our youth, knocking down barriers and negative perceptions of law enforcement and creating a safe environment for the students in the ERV. It is vital to the entire Eel River Valley that this position continue into the future.

The Fortuna Police Officer assigned to the Drug Task Force is currently leading or assisting in several high profile and large-scale investigations.

In addition to his duties with the Humboldt County Drug Task Force, our agent has been a resource to all of the law enforcement agencies in the Eel River Valley and has provided assistance and direction in many local law enforcement drug related cases.

The cost to continue to provide this police officer to the DTF with salary, benefits and outfitting, is approximately \$181,577 per year. The Fortuna Police Department was very fortunate to receive funding through Measure Z for fiscal year 2018 / 2019. Measure Z funding was provided to the City of Fortuna to assign a sworn police officer to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force. With measure Z funding, a Fortuna Police Officer has been assigned to the DTF since August 21st 2015.

A Fortuna Police Officer assigned to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force will have been assigned to the DTF for 4 years at the end of this funding cycle. This agent is a valued and integral member of the DTF team. The commander of the DTF continues to be very complimentary on the work ethic and tangible results he has seen with our DTF agent. The FPD Officer assigned to the DTF has been directly responsible for making many drug related arrests within the Eel River Valley this past year, as well as, assisting the DTF team with many other arrests throughout the county while at the DTF. In fiscal year 2018/2019 our agent played a major role in identifying and serving several search warrants on a suspected major methamphetamine and heroin drug distribution operation that was based in the Eel River Valley. This investigation resulted in the seizure of POUNDS of methamphetamine and POUNDS of heroin and several suspected drug cartel associates were arrested. In fact the FPD officer assigned to the DTF was part of the team that made the biggest seizure of heroin ever seen in Humboldt County. It should be noted that that seizure was made in the Eel River Valley.

In this past year, our agent has assisted in the seizure of several pounds of methamphetamine, heroin seizures, large scale Marijuana operations, worked surveillance and undercover operations in locations all over Humboldt County which have resulted in the seizure of <u>MILLIONS</u> of dollars in cash, assets and property from drug related arrests and operations.

Measure Z funds for the DTF agent has made a positive impact in our department and the communities in the Eel River Valley and countywide. Since being assigned to the DTF, our agency continues to see a dramatic rise in drug enforcement activity in the Eel River Valley. This agent has been responsible for, or assisted in, many large scale drug busts in not only the ERV but the entire county. Our agent has executed several search warrants, gone undercover and worked with confidential informants in the drug trade.

The FPD officer assigned to DTF reports weekly to the FPD Chief and the Chief of Police where he is briefed monthly on all cases handled by DTF in the County. Our DTF agent is a full-time member of the DTF team and has taken on many ancillary duties within the DTF office. He is well liked by the other agents and staff at the DTF office and has made a beneficial and positive addition to the DTF office resulting in direct and positive contributions to curtail illegal drug operations in Humboldt County.
