MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BY AND BETWEEN COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AND HUMBOLDT COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU"), entered into this <u>22</u> day of <u>September</u> 2020, by and between the County of Humboldt, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY," and Humboldt County Office of Education, a California government agency, hereinafter referred to as "HCOE," is made upon the following considerations:

WHEREAS, a novel coronavirus, COVID-19, causes infectious disease and was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019, and symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough and shortness of breath and outcomes have ranged from mild to severe illness, and in some cases death; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health emergency for the United States to aid the nation's health care community in responding to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has determined that the virus presents a serious public health threat; and

WHEREAS, Humboldt County had its first confirmed case of COVID-19 on February 20, 2020, and the potential of more COVID-19 cases in Humboldt County is an imminent threat; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency to exist in California; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, Humboldt County Health Officer declared a Local Health Emergency pursuant to Humboldt County Code section 2210-8 for a up to seven (7) days in the county or any area thereof, including but not limited to an imminent and proximate public health threat of the introduction of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease, chemical agent, non-communicable biologic agent, toxin, or radioactive agent; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald J. Trump declared a federal state of emergency regarding the global pandemic caused by the novel coronavirus known as SARS-CoV-2; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, Humboldt County Board of Supervisors ratified the Humboldt County Health Officer's March 11, 2020 Local Health Emergency Declaration; and

WHEREAS, Governor Newsom issued Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-33-20 in response to COVID-19 including implementing social distancing measures and stay at home order; and

WHEREAS on March 30, 2020, Humboldt County Health Officer issued a Shelter in Place Order to enable essential services to continue and to slow the spread of COVID-19 to the maximum extent possible; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY, by and through its Sheriff's Department, desires to work collaboratively with HCOE to temporarily relocate COUNTY's Emergency Operations Command and Joint Information Command at HCOE's facility known as the Sequoia Conference Center during the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic; and

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WHEREAS, COUNTY and HCOE desire to enter into an agreement which sets forth each party's rights and responsibilities regarding the operation thereof; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to memorialize the current agreement between the parties for the services provided by Contractor prior to the execution of this MOU.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES:

Each party hereto agrees to cooperate, coordinate and work collaboratively with the other party to implement the temporary relocation of COUNTY's Emergency Operations Command and Joint Information Command from COUNTY locations to HCOE's facility known as the Sequoia Conference Center, located at 901 Myrtle Avenue, Eureka, California, hereinafter referred to as "Facility," in accordance with the requirements set forth herein and Exhibit A – Shared Responsibilities and Exhibit B – Facility Use, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

2. <u>TERM</u>:

This MOU shall begin on March 23, 2020, and shall remain in full force and effect until October 15, 2020, unless sooner terminated as provided herein. This MOU may be renewed by mutual written agreement by the parties for successive thirty (30) day periods as required.

3. <u>TERMINATION</u>:

- A. <u>Breach of Contract</u>. Either party may immediately terminate this MOU, upon written notice, in the event that the other party materially defaults in performing any obligation under this MOU, or violates any laws, regulations or standards applicable to its performance hereunder.
- B. <u>Without Cause</u>. Either party may terminate this MOU without cause upon sixty (60) days advance written notice which states the effective date of the termination.
- C. <u>Insufficient Funding</u>. COUNTY's obligations under this MOU are contingent upon the availability of local, state and/or federal funds. In the event such funding is reduced or eliminated, COUNTY shall, at its sole discretion, determine whether this MOU shall be terminated. COUNTY shall provide HCOE seven (7) days advance written notice of its intent to terminate this MOU due to insufficient funding.

4. NOTICES:

Any and all notices required to be given pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the respective addresses set forth below. Notice shall be effective upon actual receipt or refusal as shown on the receipt obtained pursuant to the foregoing.

5. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:</u>

Each party hereto agrees to prepare and submit any and all reports that may be required by local, state and/or federal agencies for compliance with this MOU. Any and all reports required hereunder shall be prepared in a format that complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act, and any other applicable local, state and federal accessibility laws, regulations and standards, and submitted in accordance with any and all applicable timeframes.

6. <u>RECORD RETENTION AND INSPECTION:</u>

- A. <u>Maintenance and Preservation of Records</u>. Each party hereby agrees to timely prepare accurate and complete records, documents and other evidence relating to its performance hereunder, and to maintain and preserve said records for a period of three (3) years after expiration or termination of this MOU, or as otherwise required by any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards, except that if any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other action is pending, such records shall be retained until completion and resolution of all issues arising therefrom.
- B. <u>Inspection of Records</u>. Each party hereby agrees to make all records, documents and other evidence relating to its performance hereunder available during normal business hours to inspection, audit and reproduction by any duly authorized local, state and/or federal agencies for a period of three (3) years after expiration or termination of this MOU, or as otherwise required by any and all local, state and federal laws, regulations or standards. Each party further agrees to allow interviews of any of its employees who might reasonably have information related to such records by any duly authorized local, state and/or federal agencies. All examinations and audits conducted pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be strictly confined to those matters connected with its performance hereunder, including, without limitation, the costs of administering this MOU.
- C. <u>Audit Costs</u>. In the event of an audit exception or exceptions related to the performance of this MOU, the party responsible for not meeting the requirements set forth herein shall be responsible for the cost of the audit.

7. <u>CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION</u>:

A. <u>Disclosure of Confidential Information</u>. In the performance of this MOU, each party may receive information that is confidential under local, state or federal law. Each party hereby agrees to protect all confidential information in conformance with any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations, policies, procedures and standards, including, without limitation: Division 19 of the California Department of Social Services Manual of Policies and Procedures – Confidentiality of Information; California Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 827, 5328, 10850 and 14100.2; California Health and Safety Code Sections 1280.15 and 1280.18; the California Information Practices Act of 1977; the California Confidentiality of Medical Information Act ("CMIA"); the United States Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act ("HITECH Act"); the United States Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and any current and future implementing regulations

promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the Federal Privacy Regulations contained in Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R.") Parts 160 and 164, the Federal Security Standards contained in 45 C.F.R. Parts 160, 162 and 164 and the Federal Standards for Electronic Transactions contained in 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 162, all as may be amended from time to time.

B. <u>Continuing Compliance with Confidentiality Laws</u>. Each party hereby acknowledges that local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards pertaining to confidentiality, electronic data security and privacy are rapidly evolving and that amendment of this MOU may be required to ensure compliance with such developments. Each party agrees to promptly enter into negotiations concerning an amendment to this MOU embodying written assurances consistent with the requirements of HIPAA, the HITECH Act, the CMIA and any other applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations or standards.

8. NON-DISCRIMINATION COMPLIANCE:

- A. <u>Professional Services and Employment</u>. In connection with the execution of this MOU, neither party shall unlawfully discriminate in the provision of professional services or against any employee or applicant for employment because of: race; religion or religious creed; color; age (over forty (40) years of age); sex, including, without limitation, gender identity and expression, pregnancy, childbirth and related medical conditions; sexual orientation, including, without limitation, heterosexuality, homosexuality and bisexuality; national origin; ancestry; marital status; medical condition, including, without limitation, cancer and genetic characteristics; mental or physical disability, including, without limitation, HIV status and AIDS; political affiliation; military service; denial of family care leave; or any other classifications protected by any applicable local, state or federal laws, regulations or standards. Nothing herein shall be construed to require employment of unqualified persons.
- B. <u>Compliance with Anti-Discrimination Laws</u>. Each party further assures that it will abide by the applicable provisions of: Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975; the Food Stamp Act of 1977; Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the California Fair Employment and Housing Act; California Civil Code Sections 51, et seq.; California Government Code Sections 4450, et seq.; California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 10000; Division 21 of the California Department of Social Services Manual of Policies and Procedures; United States Executive Order 11246, as amended and supplemented by United States Executive Order 11375 and 41 C.F.R. Part 60; and any other applicable local, state and/or federal laws and regulations, all as may be amended from time to time. The applicable regulations of the California Fair Employment and Housing commission implementing California Government Code Section 12990, set forth in Sections 8101, et seq. of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations are incorporated into this MOU by reference as if set forth in full.

9. NUCLEAR-FREE HUMBOLDT COUNTY ORDINANCE COMPLIANCE:

By executing this MOU, HCOE certifies that it is not a Nuclear Weapons Contractor, in that HCOE is not knowingly or intentionally engaged in the research, development, production or testing of nuclear warheads, nuclear weapons systems or nuclear weapons components as defined by the Nuclear Free Humboldt County Ordinance. HCOE agrees to notify COUNTY immediately if it becomes a Nuclear Weapons Contractor as defined above. COUNTY may immediately terminate this MOU if it determines that the foregoing certification is false or if HCOE subsequently becomes a Nuclear Weapons Contractor.

10. INDEMNIFICATION:

- A. <u>Mutual Indemnity</u>. Each party hereto shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify the other party and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, liabilities, expenses and costs of any kind or nature, including, without limitation, attorney's fees and other costs of litigation, arising out of, or in connection with, the negligent performance of, or failure to comply with, any of the duties and/or obligations contained herein, except such loss or damage which was caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the other party or its agents, officers, officials, employees or volunteers.
- B. <u>Comparative Liability</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, in the event that both parties are held to be negligently or willfully responsible, each party will bear their proportionate share of liability as determined in any such proceeding. In such cases, each party will bear their own costs and attorney's fees.
- C. <u>Effect of Insurance</u>. Acceptance of the insurance required by this MOU shall not relieve either party from liability under this provision. This provision shall apply to all claims for damages related to either party's performance hereunder, regardless of whether any insurance is applicable or not.
- D. <u>Assumption of Risk</u>. COUNTY acknowledges and understands that HCOE makes no representation or warranty regarding the condition of the property with respect to COVID at any time during this agreement and shall have no duty or responsibility to ensure the property is sanitized or otherwise made clear of the COVID virus. COUNTY recognizes that there is presently a significant element of risk of Coronavirus transmission when any group of people gathers. COUNTY has reviewed and understands the risks reflected in the local, state, and federal alerts and guidelines. COUNTY assumes all risks, known and unknown, arising from its use and occupancy of the HCOE facility, including risks from the Coronavirus. COUNTY assumes full responsibility for any sickness, hospitalization, bodily injury, death, loss of personal property, quarantines, and all related costs and expenses of any person arising from its use and occupancy of the HCOE facility.

11. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- A. <u>General Insurance Requirements</u>. Without limiting the parties' indemnification obligations set forth herein, each party shall maintain in full force and effect, at its own expense, any and all appropriate comprehensive general liability, comprehensive automobile, workers' compensation and professional liability insurance policies.
- B. <u>Minimum Limits of Insurance</u>. Both parties, at their expense, shall procure and maintain, at a minimum:
 - 1. Commercial General Liability: \$2,000,000 General Aggregate; \$2,000,000 Products/Completed Operations Aggregate; \$1,000,000 Personal & Advertising Injury; and \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence.
 - 2. Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 per Accident for Bodily Injury & Property Damage.
 - 3. Workers' Compensation: Statutory as required by the State of California Employer's Liability: \$1,000,000 Per Accident for Bodily Injury or Disease

- 4. Umbrella / Excess Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- C. <u>Insurance Notices</u>. Any and all insurance notices required to be given pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be sent to the addresses set forth below in accordance with the notice requirements contained herein.

12. <u>RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES</u>:

It is understood that this MOU is by and between two (2) independent entities and is not intended to, and shall not be construed to, create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or any other similar association. Each party shall be solely responsible for the acts or omissions of its agents, officers, employees, assignces and subcontractors.

13. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS:

- A. <u>General Legal Requirements</u>. Each party hereto agrees to comply with any and all local, state and federal laws, regulations, policies, procedures and standards, including, without limitation, any and all local, state and federal licensure, certification and accreditation requirements, applicable to its performance hereunder.
- B. <u>Accessibility Requirements</u>. Each party hereto agrees to comply with any and all applicable accessibility requirements set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act, Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, California Government Code Section 1135 and any current and future implementing regulations, policies, procedures and standards promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the federal accessibility standards set forth in 36 C.F.R. Section 1194.1, all as may be amended from time to time.
- C. <u>Conflict of Interest Requirements</u>. Each party hereto agrees to comply with any and all applicable conflict of interest requirements set forth in the California Political Reform Act and any current and future implementing regulations, policies, procedures and standards promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, COUNTY's Conflict of Interest Code, all as may be amended from time to time.

14. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW:

This MOU is subject to any additional local, state and federal restrictions, limitations or conditions that may affect the terms, conditions or funding of this MOU. This MOU shall be read and enforced as though all legally required provisions are included herein, and if for any reason any such provision is not included, or is not correctly stated, the parties agree to amend the pertinent section to make such insertion or correction.

15. <u>REFERENCE TO LAWS, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS</u>:

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In the event any law, regulation or standard referred to herein is amended during the term of this MOU, the parties agree to comply with the amended provision as of the effective date thereof.

16. PROTOCOLS:

Both parties agree that the inclusion of additional protocols may be required. All such protocols shall be negotiated, determined and agreed upon by both parties hereto.

17. SEVERABILITY:

If any provision of this MOU, or any portion thereof, is found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, such provision shall be severable and shall not in any way impair the enforceability of any other provision of this MOU.

18. ASSIGNMENT:

Neither party shall delegate its duties nor assign its rights hereunder, either in whole or in part, without the other party's prior written consent. Any assignment in violation of this provision shall be void, and shall be cause for immediate termination of this MOU. This provision shall not be applicable to service agreements or other arrangements usually or customarily entered into by either party to obtain supplies, technical support or professional services.

19. AGREEMENT SHALL BIND SUCCESSORS:

All provisions of this MOU shall be fully binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, the parties and to each of their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and permitted assigns.

20. NO WAIVER OF DEFAULT:

The waiver by either party of any breach of this MOU shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any such breach in the future, or of the breach of any other requirement of this MOU.

21. NON-LIABILITY OF OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES:

No official or employee of either party shall be personally liable for any default or liability under this MOU.

22. AMENDMENT:

This MOU may be amended at any time during the term hereof upon the mutual consent of both parties. No addition to, or alteration of, the terms of this MOU shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by an authorized representative of each party hereto.

27. STANDARD OF PRACTICE:

Each party warrants that it has the degree of learning and skill ordinarily possessed by reputable professionals practicing in similar localities in the same profession and under similar circumstances. Each party's duty is to exercise such care, skill and diligence as professionals engaged in the same profession ordinarily exercise under like circumstances.

23. JURISDICTION AND VENUE:

This MOU shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any dispute arising hereunder, or relating hereto, shall be litigated in the State of California and venue shall lie in the County of Humboldt unless transferred by court order pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Sections 394 or 395.

24. ADVERTISING AND MEDIA RELEASE:

Each party shall obtain the written approval of the other party before any informational material related to this MOU may be used as advertising or released to the media, including, without limitation, television, radio, newspapers and internet. Each party shall inform the other party of any and all requests for interviews by media related to this MOU before such interviews take place; and the other party shall be entitled to have a representative present at such interviews. All notices required by this provision shall be given to the Director in accordance with the notice requirements set forth herein.

25. SUBCONTRACTS:

Each party shall obtain prior written approval from the other party, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, before subcontracting any of its duties or obligations hereunder. Any and all subcontracts shall be subject to all applicable terms and conditions of this MOU, including, without limitation, the confidentiality, licensing and certification requirements set forth herein. Each party shall remain legally responsible for the performance of all terms and conditions of this MOU, including, without limitation, any and all duties performed by third parties under subcontracts, whether approved by the other party or not.

26. SURVIVAL OF PROVISIONS:

The duties and obligations of the parties set forth in Section 6 – Record Retention and Inspection, Section 7 – Confidential Information and Section 10 – Indemnification shall survive the expiration or termination of this MOU.

27. CONFLICTING TERMS OR CONDITIONS:

In the event of any conflict in the terms or conditions set forth in any other agreements in place between the parties hereto and the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU, the terms and conditions set forth herein shall have priority.

28. INTERPRETATION:

This MOU, as well as its individual provisions, shall be deemed to have been prepared equally by both of the parties hereto, and shall not be construed or interpreted more favorably for one (1) party on the basis that the other party prepared it.

29. INDEPENDENT CONSTRUCTION:

The titles of the sections and subsections set forth herein are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall be disregarded in construing or interpreting any of the provisions of this MOU.

30. FORCE MAJEURE:

Neither party hereto shall be liable or responsible for delays or failures in performance resulting from events beyond the reasonable control, and without the fault or negligence, of such party. Such events

shall include, without limitation, acts of God, strikes, lockouts, riots, acts of war, epidemics, acts of government, fire, power failures, nuclear accidents, earthquakes, unusually severe weather, acts of terrorism or other disasters, whether or not similar to the foregoing.

31. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

This MOU contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this MOU shall be deemed to exist or to bind either of the parties hereto. In addition, this MOU shall supersede in their entirety any and all prior agreements, promises, representations, understandings and negotiations of the parties, whether oral or written, concerning the same subject matter. Any and all acts which may have already been consummated pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU are hereby ratified.

32. <u>COUNTERPART EXECUTION</u>:

This MOU, and any amendments hereto, may be executed in one (1) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which, when taken together, shall be deemed to be one (1) and the same agreement. This Agreement, and any amendments hereto, may be signed by manual or electronic signatures in accordance with any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards, and such signatures shall constitute original signatures for all purposes. A signed copy of this MOU, and any amendments hereto, transmitted by email or by other means of electronic transmission shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as delivery of an original executed copy of this MOU and any amendments hereto.

33. <u>AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE</u>:

Each person executing this MOU represents and warrants that he or she is duly authorized and has legal authority to execute and deliver this MOU. Each party represents and warrants to the other that the execution and delivery of this MOU and the performance of such party's obligations hereunder have been duly authorized.

34. FEDERAL PROVISIONS:

- A. HCOE acknowledges that Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) financial assistance will be used to fund this Agreement. HCOE will comply with all applicable federal law, regulations, executive orders, FEMA policies, procedures, and directives.
- B. HCOE shall at all times comply with all applicable regulations, policies, procedures, and FEMA Directives as they may be amended or promulgated from time to time during the term of this MOU, including but not limited to those requirements of 2 CFR 200.317 through 200.326 and more fully set forth in Appendix II to Part 200—Contract Provisions for non–Federal Entity Contracts Under Federal Awards, which is included herein by reference. CONTRACTOR's failure to so comply shall constitute a material breach of this contract.
- C. HCOE agrees to include the above clause in each third party subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA. It is further agreed that the clause shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to its provisions.
- D. Whether or not expressly set forth herein, all contractual provisions required by FEMA are hereby incorporated by reference. In the event of any conflict between any provision of this MOU or any FEMA term, condition, or requirement, the stricter standard shall apply. HCOE shall not perform any act, fail to perform any act, or refuse to comply with any requests that

would cause COUNTY to be in violation of any FEMA term, condition, or requirement.

E. HCOE agrees to the Federal provisions described in Exhibit D – Federal Provisions, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

EXHIBIT A SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES HCOE

- 1. HCOE agrees to all of the following:
 - a. HCOE will grant the use of its Facility to COUNTY for its Emergency Operations Command and Joint Information Command during the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic. COUNTY Departments participating include:
 - i. Humboldt County Sheriff
 - ii. Humboldt County Department of Health and Human Services
 - iii. Humboldt County Public Works
 - iv. Humboldt County Information Technology
 - b. The Facility is available for use by COUNTY staff twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week until the termination of this MOU. Hours of use are fourteen (14) hours per day, Monday through Friday, and nine (9) hours per day on Saturdays.
 - c. HCOE will provide to COUNTY staff technology access, including, without limitation:
 - i. Internet connectivity, including WiFi access;
 - ii. Printer access.
 - d. HCOE will provide cable and/or satellite television access to COUNTY staff, as available.
 - e. HCOE will provide access to kitchen facilities for limited use by COUNTY staff.
- 2. COUNTY agrees to all of the following:
 - a. No food items will be sold at the Facility.
 - b. No COUNTY employee, or any of its agents, officers, officials, or volunteers will smoke in or around the Facility as outlined by its perimeter in Exhibit B Facility Use.
 - c. Controlled and illegal substances are forbidden in or around the Facility at all times.
 - d. No illegal activity of any kind shall be permitted in or around the Facility.
 - e. Consumption of alcohol in or around the Facility is prohibited.
 - f. COUNTY shall provide adequate supervision while utilizing the Facility. With the exception of confidential information as designated by COUNTY, HCOE reserves the right to full access of all activities at any time to ensure that rules and laws are being observed. HCOE has the right to suspend any individual or group from the Facility if the behavior is determined to be abusive, destructive, or in violation of any Facility rules.
 - g. It is the COUNTY's responsibility to allow for set up and clean-up time.
 - h. Monday through Friday events involving more than one hundred fifty (150) people cannot be scheduled to begin between 8:00 and 8:30 a.m. or to end between 4:30 and 5:30 p.m. per City of Eureka restrictions pertaining to traffic on surrounding city streets.
 - i. Non-service animals are not permitted in the Facility without prior authorization from the Facility Manager or designee.
 - j. Firearms are not permitted in the Facility unless the firearm is carried by a designated Peace Officer pursuant to California Penal Code §830.
 - k. Displays or signs must be approved by the Facility or designee. Any materials used for promotional or political purposes must display a prominent statement and verbal disclaimer that the views expressed at the event are not supported or endorsed by HCOE.
 - 1. No program or part of an event shall contain matter which might tend to cause a breach of the peace, incite to riot, or which constitutes subversive doctrine or seditious utterance or which advocates for changes in our form of government or social order by violence or unlawful method.
 - m. COUNTY shall not move walls or change configuration without prior authorization from the Facility manager. COUNTY shall diligently maintain all facilities at all times, and return the facility to the same condition as received, with the exception of normal wear and tear.
 - n. A cleaning checklist is provided for each room. It is the COUNTY's responsibility to complete all of the items on the checklist prior to leaving the facility.
 - o. COUNTY agrees to participate in a pre- and post-inspection of the Facility as described in

Attachment 1 to Exhibit C - Facility Pre-Use/After-Use Inspection Form.

- p. Use of kitchen by COUNTY, or catering company contracted by COUNTY, will require a pre-use orientation with Facility Manager or designee.
- q. No tacks, nails, screws, duct tape or other items that would cause damage to walls or surfaces may be used anywhere in the Facility. Blue painters tape shall be used for hanging items.
- r. Parking in the nearby Burre Center is NOT permitted. HCOE is not responsible for costs associated with towing and/or parking tickets. Parking solutions may be discussed with the Facility manager. Use of nearby parking lots and shuttle services can be arranged on an asneeded basis.
- s. Lost and Found items will be dated when found and kept in a Lost and Found box for fourteen (14) days. After fourteen (14) days items still in the box will be donated.
- t. At no time shall there be more people admitted to the Facility or any room thereof than the legal capacity allows.
- u. No flammable decorations shall be used unless flame resistant or flame proof in accordance with the California State Health and Safety Codes.
- v. No device that produces flame, spark, smoke or explosion (including fireworks) shall be used on the premises, with the exception of tea lights and approved outdoor cooking units.
- w. COUNTY staff shall participate in HCOE disaster and fire drills should they occur during meeting time. In the event of an earthquake, staff are required to duck, cover, and hold until the movement stops, then leave when instructed that it is safe to do so by HCOE staff. In the event of a fire, staff are to evacuate the building by the nearest exit in an orderly manner.
- x. The use of surge protectors is prohibited.
- y. COUNTY promises that no person acting on behalf of COUNTY or visiting the Premises shall be within proximity of any K-12 student unless accompanied by an authorized HCOE employee as arranged in advance, or after passing a Department of Justice fingerprinting clearance. As used herein, "proximity" means close enough to a student to engage in unsupervised verbal communication.
- 3. COUNTY shall do all of the following:
 - a. Provide custodial services.
 - b. Communicate to staff the practice of, and provide the enforcement of, social distancing, defined as maintaining space of at least three (3) feet between persons.
 - c. COUNTY Information Technology staff will provide cybersecurity as appropriate.


HCOE will invoice the COUNTY for a portion of the calculated rate of the use of Sequoia Conference Center at \$121,800.00. HCOE will donate the remaining amount of \$192,210.00 in support of COVID-19 response. COUNTY will pay HCOE for costs and expenses incurred from March 23, 2020 to October 15, 2020 for the facility rental as invoiced pursuant to the terms and conditions of this agreement upon receipt of reimbursement for this expense from the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

COUNTY will be responsible to pay \$900.00 monthly to HCOE to pay for the additional phone lines that were added to the Sequoia Conference Center to accommodate the need of the COUNTY. COUNTY will pay this expense within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice.

Beginning October 16, 2020, HCOE will charge COUNTY \$18,000.00 per month for their use of the Sequoia Conference Center Monday-Friday for 14 hours per day, and Saturdays for 9 hours with Limited Kitchen Use each day. The Rental Agreement will be reviewed and renewed as needed and agreed upon by HCOE and COUNTY, on the 1st of each month until the end of the event. COUNTY will pay this expense within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice.

EXHIBIT D FEDERAL PROVISIONS HCOE For Fiscal Years 2019-2020 through 2020-2021

1. ACCESS TO RECORDS:

The following access to records requirements applies to this Agreement:

- A. HCOE agrees to provide the COUNTY, the FEMA Administrator, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their authorized representatives' access to any books, documents, papers, and records of CONTRACTOR which are directly pertinent to this MOU for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions.
- B. HCOE agrees to permit any of the foregoing parties to reproduce by any means whatsoever or to copy excerpts and transcriptions as reasonably needed.
- C. HCOE agrees to provide the FEMA Administrator or their authorized representatives' access to construction or other work sites pertaining to the work being completed under the MOU.
- D. In compliance with the Disaster Recovery Act of 2018, the COUNTY and HCOE acknowledge and agree that no language in this MOU is intended to prohibit audits or internal reviews by the FEMA Administrator or the Comptroller General of the United States.

2. <u>REMEDIES</u>:

In the event of a material breach by a party of any term or provision of this MOU, the other party shall have the right to pursue all available remedies at law or equity, including recovery of damages and specific performance of this MOU. The parties hereto agree that monetary damages might not provide adequate compensation for any losses incurred by reason of a material breach by it of material provisions of this MOU and hereby further agree that, in the event of any action for specific performance in respect of such breach, it shall waive the defense against specific performance that a remedy at law would be adequate. Except as expressly provided elsewhere in this MOU, each party's rights and remedies under this MOU are cumulative and in addition to, not exclusive of or in substitution for, any rights or remedies otherwise available to that party.

3. <u>CLEAN AIR ACT</u>:

HCOE agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. Section 7401 et seq.

HCOE agrees to report each violation to the COUNTY and understands and agrees that the COUNTY will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.

HCOE agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA.

4. <u>FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT</u>:

HCOE agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the

Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. Sections 1251 et seq.

HCOE agrees to report each violation to the COUNTY and understands and agrees that the COUNTY will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.

HCOE agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA.

5. DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION CLAUSE:

This MOU is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such, HCOE is required to verify that none of HCOE, its principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995), or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).

HCOE must comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.

This certification is a material representation of fact relied upon by the COUNTY. If it is later determined that HCOE did not comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to the COUNTY, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

The bidder or proposer agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or proposer further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

6. BYRD ANTI-LOBBYING AMENDMENT, 31 U.S.C. §1352 (AS AMENDED)

HCOE who apply or bid for an award of \$100,000 or more shall file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient who in turn will forward the certification(s) to COUNTY.



Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

10. PROGRAM FRAUD AND FALSE OR FRAUDULENT STATEMENTS OR RELATED ACTS:

HCOE acknowledges that 31 U.S.C. Chapter 38 (Administrative Remedies for False Claims and Statements) applies to HCOE's actions pertaining to this MOU.
