Panther Gap Less Than Three Acre Conversion Mitigation Plan

This document has been prepared pursuant to Section 55.4.10(j) of the Humboldt County Commercial Medical Marijuana Land Use Ordinance, applications for Commercial Cannabis Activity occupying sites created through prior unauthorized conversion of timberland. The document evaluates site conditions and conversion history for the parcel and contains a Registered Professional Foresters (RPF's) recommendation as to remedial actions necessary to bring the conversion area into compliance with provisions of the Forest Practice Act.

3. Project Description

a. Timber stand characteristics including species composition and age class.

The Panther Gap property is within a Douglas fir/Tanoak / and Madrone forest. The surrounding forest composition consists primarily of uneven-age second growth Douglas-fir, tanoak, and pacific madrone with a minor amount of other hardwood species. Understory vegetation consist of huckleberry, manzanita, poison oak, and ferns. All species combined (conifer & hardwood) basal areas is approximately 130 square feet (sq. ft.) per acre with closed canopy. The property is zoned Unclassified (U).

b. Watercourse and Lake Protection Zones (WLPZ) which exist within the boundaries of the parcel or immediate vicinity of the project (Section 916.4)

The property does contain a class II & class III watercourse that require WLPZ or ELZ protection. As per the Forest Practice Rules, the riparian buffers requirements are listed as follows:

Class II standard watercourse 14CCR 916.9(g): (within the Coastal Anadromy Zone)

ZONE WIDTHS:

Channel Zone = channel between the WTL. <30% = 15' Core Zone and 50' Inner Zone 30%-50% = 15' Core Zone and 75' Inner Zone >50% = 15' Core Zone and 100' Inner Zone

Class III watercourses 14CCR 916.9(h): (Class III watercourses within a coastal anadromy zone)

ELZ WIDTHS:

30 ft. for side slopes <30%. 50 ft. for side slopes >30%.

c. Describe the timber harvest history, including timber operations within the parcel prior to the unauthorized conversion.

A portion of the property was harvested in 2016 under THP# 1-15-035 HUM. The harvest incorporated the Group Selection silviculture using tractor skidding and encompassed approximately 30 acres.

d. Identify and describe any portions of the parcel that are part of the unauthorized conversion of timberland. Calculate the total acreage of all areas converted. Differentiate between discrete (non-contiguous) areas of conversion and provide relevant sub-totals of these acreages.

There are 10 sites in addition to the current permitted cultivation site, totaling approximately 1.19 acres of cultivation area on the property. There are two sites which meet the definition of a conversion consisting of approximately 0.20acres (see table below).

4. Analysis of Consistency between Unauthorized Conversion and Forest Practice Rules.

Site 1 (Historic road/ Creek)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The majority of the site is within a class II WLPZ Zone and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic pots, plastic bags, and drip lines. No timber harvesting has occurred in or around this site in the last ten years. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

General Mitigations for property: Road Points (RP) are specific locations that are currently in conflict with the Forest Practice Rules or have potential to cause environmental damage. No road points have been identified from where the access road enters the property to and around the conversion/cultivation sites. Note only roads currently used by the landowner and skidtrails within the 2016 harvest area were assessed; legacy roads and past skid trails were not evaluated.

Site 1 Mitigations: Because the site is within WLPZ all plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site.

Site 2 (A & B) (Creek)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is within a class II WLPZ Zone and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic pots, plastic bags, plant stakes, fencing, and drip lines. No timber harvesting has occurred in or around this site in the last ten years. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 2 Mitigations: Because the site is within WLPZ all plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site and the associated stream. Remove the fencing as it present an entanglement hazard to wildlife.

Site 3 (Historic skid trail/Creek)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The majority of the site is within a class II WLPZ Zone and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic pots, plastic bags, plant stakes, and drip lines. Timber harvesting has occurred adjacent to this site in 2016. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 3 Mitigations: Because the site is within WLPZ all plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site.

Site 4(A&B) (Historic skid trail)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is outside of any creek zones and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic pots, plastic bags, plant stakes, wooden terraces, fencing, drying wires, and drip lines. Timber harvesting has occurred in or around this site in 2016. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present currently however the site is on steep ground and potential for future erosion issues exist. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 4 Mitigations: All plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site although the site is outside of the WLPZ the site is on steep ground which allows derbies to end up in the stream below. Remove the single strand wires and fencing as they present a hazard to people and wildlife. The site shall be monitored for erosion issues and if detected the site should be stabilized as necessary using straw mulching, slashpacking, or other suitable measures.

Site 5 (Historic landing & skid trail)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is outside of any creek zones and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic bags, plant stakes, fencing, and drip lines. Timber harvesting has occurred in or around this site in 2016 some of the site was disturbed from the timber operations and may have been larger. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 5 Mitigations: All plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site to improve the aesthetic and protect wildlife within the area from entrapment and entanglement. Remove the fencing as it present an entanglement hazard to wildlife.

Site 6 (Trending Ridge)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is outside of any creek zones and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. The site may extend over the property boundary though the exact boundary was not established. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic and metal pots, plastic water barrels, a detreating plastic pool use for water storage, plant stakes, fencing & wire plant cages, and drip lines. Timber harvesting not has occurred in or around this site in the last 10 years. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 6 Mitigations: All plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site to improve the aesthetic and protect wildlife within the area from entrapment and entanglement. Remove the fencing as it present an entanglement hazard to wildlife.

Site 7 (Spring Terraces)

History: The site meets the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The majority of the site is within the Class II creek zone and appears to have been converted to cultivate cannabis around 2009 from air photo review. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are a water storage tank, plastic bags, drip lines, and extensive wooden terraces. Timber harvesting has not occurred in or around this site in the last 10 years. The site is located within 35' of a spring head which the current landowner holds rights to. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. Erosion issues were addressed by the current landowner utilizing straw mulching to prevent surface erosion however future erosion issues may arise when the terraces degrade. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time of the conversion or when the cultivation site was in use.

Site 7 Mitigations: All plastics (drip lines, bags, etc...) should be removed from the site. Two sheets of fiberglass tin which were used to cover the spring shall also be removed as they will degrade and may lead to contamination of the spring and watercourse below. The site shall be monitored for erosion issues and mitigated as feasible given the limited access to the site. The site shall be planted with native conifers at a 12 X 12 or less spacing to restore forest canopy and to facilitate long term stability of the area.

Site 8 (Ridge Flat)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is outside of any creek zones and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2006 - 2012. The site is located on a flatter area on a southwestern trending ridge. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are several plastic water barrels, a plastic bags, plastic pots, plant stakes, fencing, drying wires, and drip lines. Timber harvesting occurred in 2016 in or around this site. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present.

No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 8 Mitigations: All plastics (drip lines, pots, bags, etc...) shall be removed from the site to improve the aesthetic and protect wildlife within the area from entrapment and entanglement. Remove the fencing and single strand wires as they present a hazard to people and wildlife.

Site 9 (Road and Skid trail)

History: The site does not meet the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is outside of any creek zones and appears to have been utilized to cultivate cannabis between 2014 and 2015. The site is located partially on a road grade and what appears to be an old skidtrail. The site was utilized by the current landowner; however the site was abandoned has been cleaned up. The only features left are the depression where the plants were planted in the ground. Timber harvesting occurred in 2016 in or around this site. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. The site has been covered with straw mulch to reduce surface erosion. The parcel was under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the cultivation site was in use.

Site 9 Mitigations: The site shall be monitored for erosion issues if surface erosion is evident straw mulch or other erosion control methods shall be implemented.

Site 10 (Ridge top)

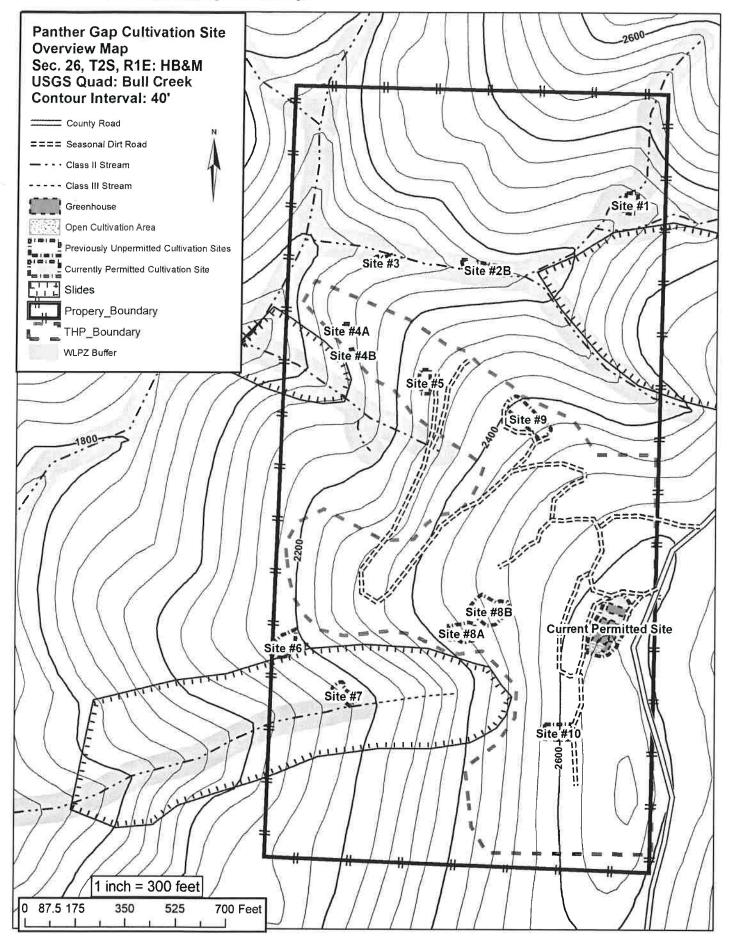
History: The site is near a clearing visible from air photo review and meets the definition of a conversion as per forest practice rules (14CCR1104.1). The site is outside of any creek zones and appears to have been cleared to cultivate cannabis between around 2009. Currently the site is abandoned and the only features left are some plastic pots, plastic bags, plant stakes, and drip lines. Timber harvesting occurred in 2016 and a selection group was placed on or near the site which may have obscured portions of the original site. No threatened or endangered animals and plants present within 1000' as per 2018 CNDDB search. No hazard reduction issues are present. No erosion issues present. The parcel was not under the ownership of Richard McLennan at the time the conversion or when the cultivation site was in use.

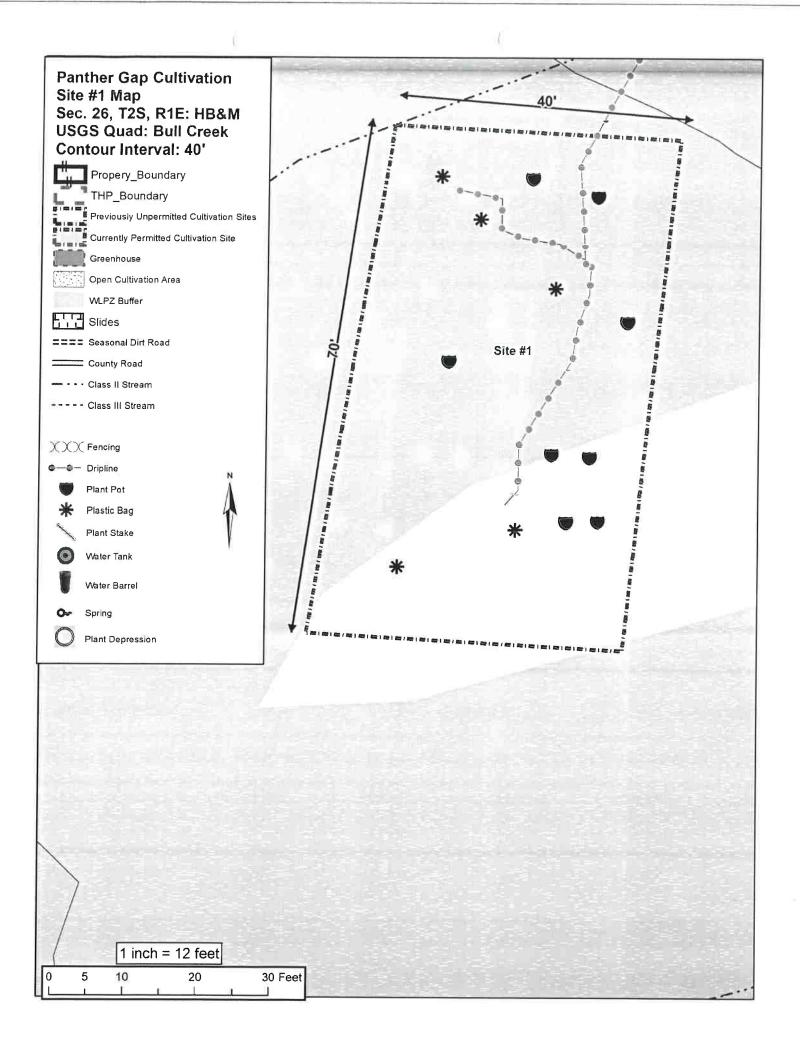

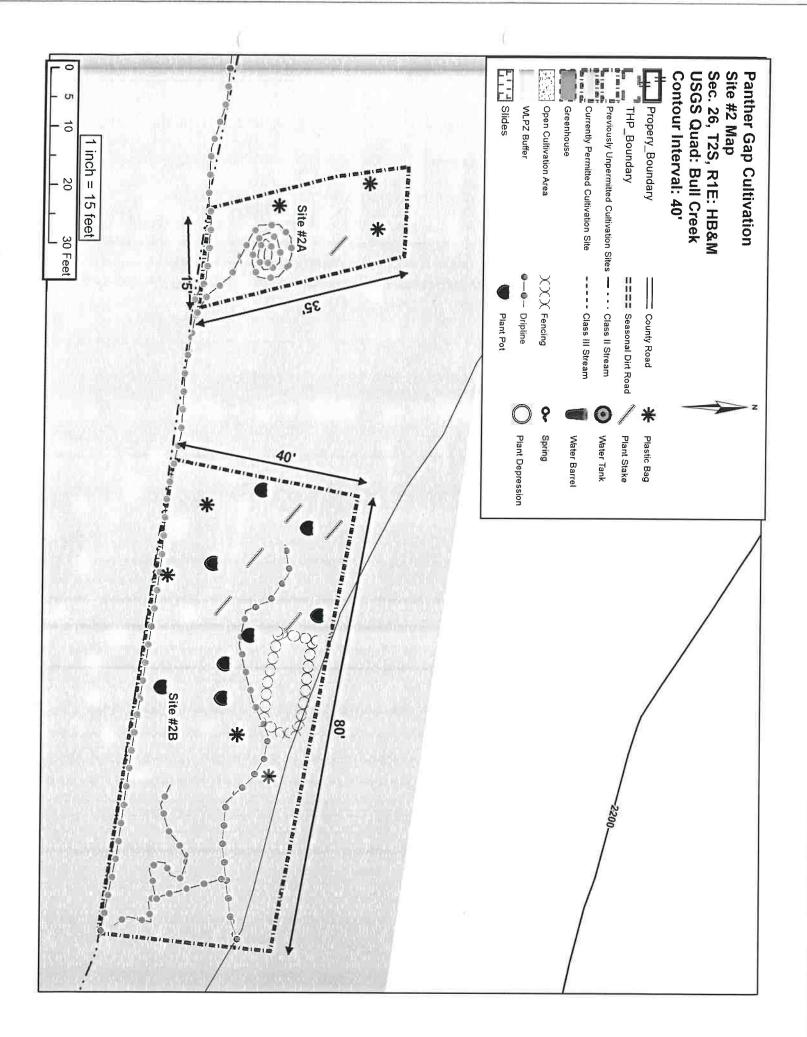
Current permitted cannabis cultivation site.

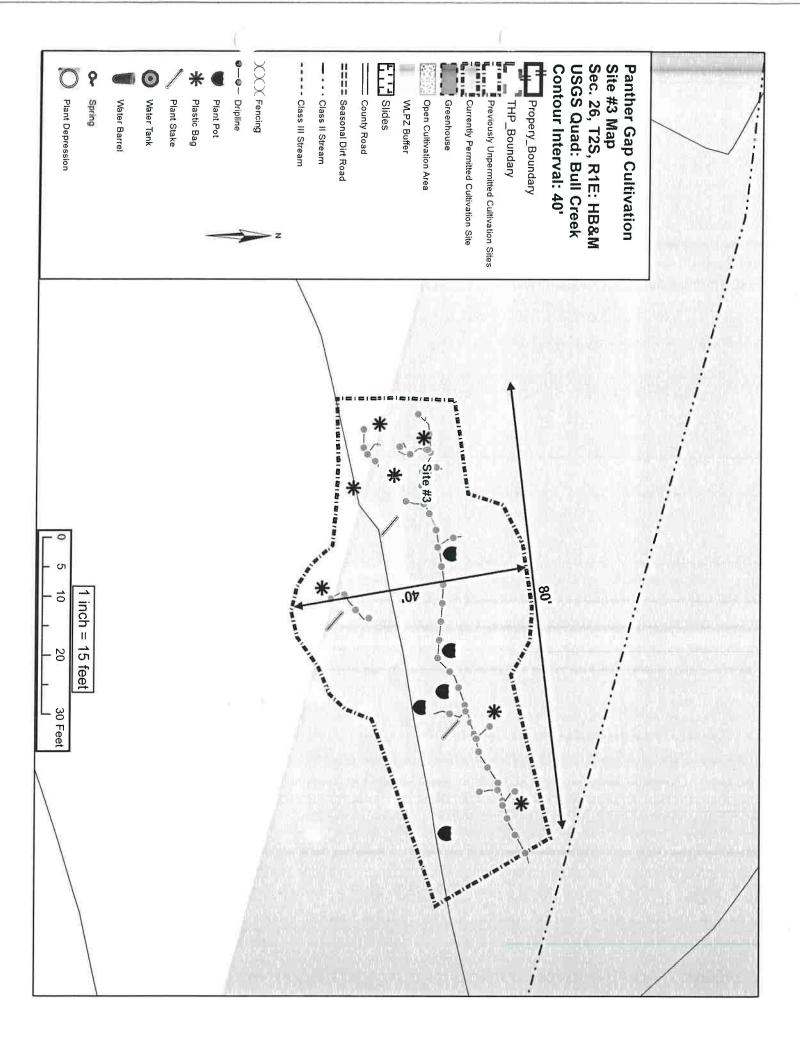
