To the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors,

We, the members of the Humboldt Creative Alliance, respectfully submit this appropriation request for one-time funding in the amount of \$500,000 for nonprofit performing arts centers, arts organizations, and nonprofit event producers that have been shuttered or financially hamstrung since early last year. A preliminary list of these art non profit organizations is attached to this letter.

Many industries have been turned upside down by the pandemic and the suffering is widespread, but Covid-19 has had an outsized impact on our industry cluster. Public health directives shut down the entire live entertainment industry overnight. Revenues instantly fell to zero. Performing arts organizations and venue owners have spent the last sixteen months begging and borrowing to stay alive. As gig workers, many performers, musicians, and technicians lost their complete income. Others had no choice but to go on unemployment or attempt to completely change their careers. The same has gone for all of the festivals - The Kinetic Grand Championship, The Baduat Festival, Redwood Coast Music Festival, North Country Fair and so many more - that have been county institutions for decades, bringing all of us together. The calendar of 2020 and the first half of 2021 was empty, depriving artists, craftspeople, and event producers of needed income, nonprofit organizations of vital fundraisers, and the county of valuable tourism dollars. Visual artists have suffered from gallery closures and the shutdown of events like Arts Alive. According to a study by California Arts Advocates, 59% of workers in creative industries were unemployed in 2020.

The state reopening has been a welcome change, but has also presented a new set of challenges. It's an uncertain future, with Covid still endemic in the community and the public angrily divided over appropriate policies and safety measures moving forwards. To compound that, event production requires significant upfront investment. Many arts organizations, venues, and event producers have found themselves in a catch-22, legally able to finally re-open, but without the funds on hand to do so. These difficult circumstances mean that even with the re-opening, many arts organizations and events may not be able to survive. Or even if they do, their recovery will be painfully slow. An immediate County investment in the Arts and Culture sector is an important priority for the following reasons:

• Investment means that more art non profit organizations and events survive through 2021 and into 2022, and the Arts and Culture sector overall experiences a stronger recovery.

- The stronger the recovery in this sector, the faster lost jobs come back, as art organizations rehire laid-off staff and independent artists and producers get back on the County events circuit.
- A strong recovery for the Arts and Culture sector has a significant secondary effect for other related industries, including restaurants, bars, retail, and hospitality. According to a study by Americans for the Arts, cultural tourists spend an average of \$28.35 more per person.
- The Arts and Culture sector is a vital part of Humboldt County's destination identity. Our county is in a unique position to capitalize on a potent combination of natural beauty, burgeoning cannabis tourism, and a vibrant arts and events scene. Tourism brought the County more than \$40M in tax revenue in 2019 supporting the Arts and Culture sector is a smart investment that will repay itself.
- Beyond any economic considerations, local arts, entertainment, and festivals are a beloved, and deeply missed piece of Humboldt's culture and an integral part of our quality of life and community identity.
- Finally, government investment in Arts and Culture is broadly supported by the public. According to another study by Americans for the Arts, 60% of Americans approve of increased local government funding for the arts.

In light of the ongoing struggles faced by the Arts and Culture sector and the benefits of timely action, we are asking the Board of Supervisors to address the issue locally through the allocation of arts funding. We recommend a fund in the amount of \$500,000, to be invested in all nonprofit arts organizations in Humboldt County and re-granted through The Ink People Center for the Arts. This funding will constitute meaningful support for all of the arts organizations, artists, and producers who beautify our daily walks, make the festivals, and create the events that establish our sense of place, nurture our belonging, and build our community.
