SUBJECT:

Extension of Extra Help Hours for Parks & Recreation Budget Unit 1100-713 (4/5 Vote Required)

RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Authorize the extension of extra help employment hours for Park Caretaker I, Christopher Vance, to a maximum of 1,920 hours for fiscal year (FY) 2021-22 (4/5 vote required).

SOURCE OF FUNDING:

General Fund, Parks & Recreation (1100713)

DISCUSSION:

Christopher Vance has been working as an extra help employee during the current fiscal year. To date, Mr. Vance has worked a total of 884 hours as a Park Caretaker I. The Parks & Recreation Division of the Humboldt County Department of Public Works is requesting an extension of extra help hours to the total of 1,920 for the remainder of FY 2021-22. The requested extension of extra help hours is necessary to maintain the level of services provided by, and maintain the workload of, the Parks & Recreation Division of the Department of Public Works.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Estimated salary and benefit cost for the requested extension of extra-help is \$5,908 for Parks & Recreation budget unit 1100-713. This estimate is based on Mr. Vance working 40 hours per week

through the remainder of FY 2021-22. There are sufficient funds in the FY 2021-22 Parks & Recreation budget to cover the additional cost of these hours.

All extra help employees working beyond 960 hours are subject to paying into the California Public Employee Retirement System (“PERS”). The additional costs for PERS have been included in the estimated salary and benefit costs for the requested extension of extra-help hours. The Affordable Care Act requires large employers with 50 or more employees to offer health coverage to all full-time employees. The Department of Public Works is aware of the federal provisions that impact extra help employment. The Department of Public Works is also aware that the standard measurement period of employee hours will occur over the course of a 52-week period.

STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK:

The recommended action supports the Board of Supervisors’ Strategic Framework by providing community-appropriate levels of service and to ensure the sustainability of such services.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

None

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board could choose not to authorize the requested extension of extra help hours. However, this alternative is not recommended since not extending hours would create an increased workload for existing staff and reduce the level of service provided by the Parks & Recreation Division of the Department of Public Works.
