SUBJECT: Annual Update 2025-2026

## Summary of Commission Activities

- Meeting start time changed from 6:30 PM to 6:00 PM (March 2025) to allow more time for speakers.
- Supervisors invited to share ideas; Commission discussed ways to support Board priorities from the Humboldt County Plan.
- Topics monitored: Pacific Fisheries Management Council recommendations, Nordic Fish Farm, Fish Cleaning Station cost research, Wharfinger boat ramp repairs and eelgrass clearance, declining access to fishing/hunting areas, offshore wind development (on hold), mammalian composting issues, fishing and hunting regulations, review of Natural Resources Element, and grant cycle restart pending CDFW approval.
- Elk management recommendations and elk tag discussion with CDFW representative.
- Fish and Game Commission Grant Awards. Recommend that the Board of Supervisors grant (these requests at this amount) totaling no more than \$5000.
- Drafted new bylaws for the commission, January 2026 for approval.
